1. At the request of [redacted] chief of [redacted] branch at NSA, several research and analysis officers were briefed on 27 May 1975 concerning the above subject. The NSA personnel included [redacted]

The briefing began by reviewing the history of OTS involvement with parapsychology at SRI since 1972. The major portion of the briefing was spent on the past one year contract at SRI. Mention of continuing operational evaluation of one subject and the discontinuance of further R&D was made.

2. The audience was told the subject matter was sensitive and controversial within CIA. It was my intention to give them the facts, my opinion and interpretation of the facts and summary of counter opinions and interpretations of those same facts.

3. The briefing continued for about 1-1/2 hours and was seriously received. The bottom line was the usual "very interesting, important....but I don't see where we have a role to play to effect anything. Please keep us informed."
