
### MONKEY SHINES





























































































# Magicans secrets



### THE PULSATING POP BOTTLE

Merlin did this trick long before there were dimes or popbottles! Merlin merely puts a dime on the top of a bottle, holds the bottle in his hands and the dime jumps up and down. As long as Merlin holds the bottle the dime throbs up and down, up and down. Even for a while after Merlin lets go his magic touch, the dime pops up and down.

HOW TO DO IT. A cold pop bottle works best! The dime and rim of the bottle should be moistened without anyone seeing you do it. Then merely fit the dime to cover the rim of the


opening of the bottle. Hold the bottle securely with both hands keeping the bottle firmly on a table. The coin will automatically start popping up and down. The warmth of your hands penetrates the cold bottle, the warm air inside the bottle then rises and releases itself through the top of the bottle making the dime move up and down.


ODD OR EVEN You just can't miss with this one! Shake some coins in your hand and tell people to guess whether the total is odd or even. But before they guess, you assure them that they'll be wrong! It always happens that way!

HERE'S THE SYSTEM: Use three coins, like a dime, a nickel and a penny. If they say "Even", you show them three coins in your hand — an odd number! But if they say "Odd" you add

up the value of the coins: Ten, five, one - and it comes out sixteen cents - an even amount. So they'll be wrong either way!

A quarter, dime and penny is another good combination. In any case, the addition of some extra pennies will not injure the "either way" system on which the trick depends.







### MAGNETIZED KNIFE
