GEORGE WITTBOLD, Westchester Country Club, Westchester, New York, advised on October 18, 1950 that STANLEY RICH was employed by him as a model maker at the New York World's Fair for approximately one year in 1939-1940. Mr. WITTBOLD stated that he was responsible for building the General Motors Exhibit "Futurama" at the World's Fair. He added that this General Motors Exhibit was designed by NORMAN BEL GEDDES, and he, WITTBOLD, constructed it. He stated that he employed approximately 1700 men in building the exhibit, and STANLEY RICH was one of his employees. He further stated that all records maintained by him for that exhibit have been destroyed, and STANLEY RICH was one of the few employees he was able to remember.

He stated that he is not able to remember anything pertinent about RICH, and knows nothing of his private life. He added that the only reason why he remembered RICH was that he had particularly close contact with the model makers who constructed the miniature villages.

Mr. WITTBOLD has the floral concession at the Hotel Waldorf-Astoria and at the present time, is building a home at Armonk Village, Armonk, New York.

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DARION was shown the photographs and given the names of persons who have figured in the ROSENBERG - GLASSMAN - SOBELL investigation, and in each instance was quite definite that neither the name nor the photograph was familiar to him with the exception of the photograph of JULIUS ROSENBERG which he said seemed somewhat familiar, but he could not say in what connection.

Mrs. HELEN DARION advised on October 26, 1950 that she was born in Brooklyn, New York, on January 5, 1915. Her maiden name was HELEN SOLCLOM. She attended New Utrecht High School and also Brooklyn College, graduating from the latter in 1934 or 1935. Her major at Brooklyn College was Spanish. While in college she became interested in the modern dance and still is active in that to the present time, although she has never earned her livelihood from it. In her junior and senior years at Brooklyn College she was employed part time by the Jewish Publicity Bureau. Sometime in 1935 she was married to JOSEPH DARION.

In 1942, after having been unemployed for some years, she served as a volunteer typist at the China Aid Council. She had previously appeared as a dancer at a charity benefit given by the China Aid Council. After several months' voluntary work at the Council, she was told in September 1943 that she might obtain a job as stenographer at the Council to replace one SELMA KEEMAN who had terminated her employment there. She began work as stenographer after learning shorthand in the space of one week in October 1943. She remained at the China Aid Council until April 1949 when the activities of the Council became so curtailed that there was little or no work for her to do.

In 1940 she and her husband were residing at 117 East 15th Street, New York City. In the same year she first joined the Communist Party, belonging to a club which was located on lower Second Avenue. She was active in this club for about a year. Mrs. DARION was unable to remember the name of the club, but stated that it had an Italian name. The meetings were open and were attended by 75 to 100 persons. They were held approximately every two weeks. Mrs. DARION attended meetings frequently during 1940 and part of 1941. She then became bored with the organization and became almost inactive.

Mrs. DARION stated, however, that she was approached from time to time by individuals who attempted to persuade her to return to the Communist Party. She would then attend a few more meetings and also assisted in

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canvassing for candidates which were supported by the Communist Party at election time.

In 1942 the DARIONS moved to Knickerbocker Village. At that time Mrs. DARION joined a Communist Party club whose headquarters were located on Market Street between Monroe and Madison Streets. At the time of her joining she was asked to become secretary of the club. She served in this capacity for several months and, finding that the responsibility was too great, gave up the position. Mrs. DARION was unable to recall the names of any officers or members of the Second Avenue Communist Party club or the Market Street Communist Party club.

She did recall, however, a woman whom she knew as GOLDIE who may have been educational director of the Market Street club. She described this woman as a blonde girl who resided in the "A" unit of Knickerbocker Village. She was unaware of this individual's last name.

In 1945 when the Communist Political Association again became known as the Communist Party, Market Street Communist organization was broken up into smaller clubs which then met in the homes of the various members. Mrs. DARION became a member of one such club whose membership came solely from Knickerbocker Village. She stated that this club was composed mainly of housewives living in the project. She commented that while the club's formal purpose was to meet and discuss various questions concerning Communism, the Jewish question, the Negro question, etc., it in effect was nothing more than a group of housewives whose main topics of conversation were food prices and their children. Mrs. DARION then lost interest inasmuch as she was a working woman and had little or nothing in common with the other members of the club.

She recalled an individual by the name of ELLIOTT WHITE who was rather prominent in the Communist Party in her neighborhood. She stated, however, that he was not a member of the Knickerbocker Village club and added that he is now dead.

She also recalled an individual by the name of NORMA whom she believed was the Communist Party organizer for her neighborhood.

She stated that she may have been carried on Communist Party records as a treasurer of a Communist unit and does recall handling dues

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collected from Communist Party members in the Market Street Club for a short time in 1944. She stated, however, that she held no office and performed no official functions as an officer in 1946 or 1947. She stated that in the latter part of 1947 she dropped completely out of the Communist Party movement and has had no contact with the Communists since that time.

In April 1949 after leaving the China Aid Council, she made application for a position at the United Service for New Americans, 15 Park Row, New York City. She was accepted and began working there as a secretary in that same month.

HELEN stated that at the United Service for New Americans she was employed as a Board secretary. At the United Service for New Americans she became acquainted with VIVIAN GLASSMAN who was also employed in the executive offices of the organization. She stated that she knew little about VIVIAN GLASSMAN, but stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN appears to be a person of good character.

Mrs. DARION stated that there is a conflict going on within the United Service for New Americans at the present time between the UCPWA and the CIO, the latter now attempting to organize the group. She stated that VIVIAN GLASSMAN is very anti-UOPWA.

Mrs. DARION advised that she first met subject and his wife when RICH was stationed at the Brooklyn Navy Yard. In a Personnel Security Questionnaire dated November 23, 1960, WEINGARTEN listed his wife as LEOCHE (MIRHELL) WEINGARTEN, born September 29, 1917 at New York City and his children as DONALD E. WEINGARTEN, born February 16, 1945 at Boston, Massachusetts and ALAN P. WEINGARTEN, born October 6, 1949 at New York, New York.

Military Service

A review of the records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, on March 16, 1965 by IC [REDACTED] showed that IRVING ROBERT WEINGARTEN, Serial Number 12 004 601, indicated he enlisted in the United States Army Air Corps on May 6, 1942, and served on active duty until November 2, 1942, at which time he was honorably discharged as an Aviation Cadet at Scott Field, Illinois. He accept a commission as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army Air Corps Reserve.

On November 3, 1942, he was appointed and accepted a commission as a Second Lieutenant under Serial Number O 856 175 and served on active duty until April 3, 1946, at which time he was honorably released from active duty as a Captain at Mitchel Field, New York, and retained in the United States Army Air Corps Reserve.

He served in the United States Army Air Corps and Air Force Reserve, inactive status, from April 4,

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1945, to April 1, 1953, at which time his commission was terminated by reason of failing to report an indefinite commission in the United States Air Force Reserve.

He had no Foreign Service. He was awarded the Army Commendation Ribbon, American Campaign Medal and the World War II Victory Medal. His character and efficiency ratings ranged from unknown to excellent and there is no record of courts-martial or absence without official leave.

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Affiliation with the Young
Communist League at CCNY

On May 20, 1951, MILTON MAHER at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, advised SA RICHARD B. COTTER that he joined the Young Communist League at CCNY in about January, 1937. He said that the following persons all of whom were either engineering or chemistry students at CCNY were active members of the Young Communist League (YCL) and attended meetings with him during the first six months of 1937:

JULIUS ROBINSON
MARK PAGE also known as Mark Fogarty
MAX SUSSMAN
BENJAMIN
IRVING WEINBERG

On January 4, 1950, NATHAN SUSSMAN, admitted YCL member at CCNY, advised SAs BERT S. TAYLOR and PAUL J. BLASCO that IRVING ROBERT WEINBERG, class of 1933, at CCNY, was one of the individuals who attended one or more YCL meetings of either the "Main Club" or the "Steinmetz Club" at CCNY.

Among individuals SUSSMAN identified as having attended one or more YCL meetings of either the "Main Club" or the "Steinmetz Club" were STANLEY RICH, JOEL BARR, MORTON BOGELL and MORRIS SHUTSKY of the class of 1936 and JOSEPH GOLDFELD and HENRY M. BODNET of the class of 1939. He stated that JOSEPH GOLDFELD was also Educational Director for the "Steinmetz Club."

Interview of IRVING WEINBERG

WEINBERG was interviewed on September 19, 1955 by SA PETER O. ROYAL, Jr. at Syracuse, New York.

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WEINBARTEN stated that he did not recall AARON NICHAN COLEMAN nor did he remember an individual by the name of MATHAN SUSSMAN. He was shown photographs of JOEL BARR, WILLIAM DANZIGER, MAX ELITCHER, WILLIAM KUTTERPERL, STANLEY RICH, JULIUS ROSENBERG, ROBERT SAVITT, MELBY SLODKET, NORMAN DONELL, MATHAN SUSSMAN and AARON NICHAN COLEMAN.

After viewing these photographs WEINBARTEN said he did not recognize any of them except that of JULIUS ROSENBERG and stated that he recalled seeing that photograph in newspapers and magazines after ROSENBERG'S arrest.

On May 15, 1965, IRVING ROBERT WEINBARTEN, 81 East Greenridge Avenue, Elmhurst, New York, was interviewed by SA LOREN E. BIDWELL.

WEINBARTEN said he was born September 30, 1918 and graduated from CCNY in June of 1938 with a Bachelor of Science degree majoring in chemistry. He said that while at CCNY he was aware of the YCL because it was especially noisy on the campus. He denied ever attending any meetings. WEINBARTEN stated that the only activity in which he engaged at CCNY was the promotion of an open house program at the college the purpose of which he said was to alleviate in some measure the bad name CCNY had received because of Communist activities. WEINBARTEN stated that he might well have appeared before such a group as the YCL as a speaker but if so his only interest was in behalf of the open house program. He stated he was positive that he had never attended YCL meetings or had joined that organization.

On January 20, 1965, IRVING ROBERT WEINBARTEN, 675 Academy Street, telephonically contacted the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and advised that he was an independent consultant under the firm name of Weinbarten Instruments, 675 Academy Street, New York City.

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He advised that in the Fall of 1943 he attended the first radar school at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology-Harvard School at which Air Force officers were instructed in the use of radar. WEINGARTEN stated that he was then a Second Lieutenant in the Air Force.

He stated that employed at Harvard University as a civilian was STANLEY RICH who was doing research in underwater sonar and was an electrical engineer.

WEINGARTEN advised that one day RICH came up to him and asked would he ever transmit radar information to a Russian agent. WEINGARTEN stated that he would. WEINGARTEN added that nothing ever came of the conversation and that he has never seen RICH since that time.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

2/2/65

1. Dr. IRVING R. WEINMARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

WEINMARTEN stated that he graduated from Stuyvesant High School in New York City in 1934.

He said that in the summer of 1934 he filled out an application and joined the Young Communist League (YCL) in the Bronx, New York City. The particular group that he joined was organized in the vicinity of Ward and Westchester Avenue in the Bronx, New York, and met in premises over the Ward Theater.

He continued his education in 1934 at the College of the City of New York (CCNY) and was graduated from the college in June of 1938 with a BS Degree.

He continued his activity as a member of the YCL at CCNY.

He initially entered the School of Science at CCNY and in 1935 - 1936 transferred to the School of Technology in the Chemical Engineering field. He transferred back to the School of Science and was graduated from that school in 1938.

In the same small YCL group that he was the leader of, MORTON SOBELL, NATHAN SUSSMAN, and JULIUS ROSENBERG were members of the group. He said there were five or six people in this particular group of which he was the leader.

He said that when he transferred back to the School of Science in 1936 he then was thrown back into a larger group of YCL members.

He stated that after graduation from the CCNY in 1938, he continued his education to take a Master's degree. He was attached to the staff at CCNY in this particular year too.

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After securing his Masters Degree, he obtained employment in the New York City high schools and taught in the fields of Chemistry and Physics in New Dorp High School in Staten Island and the Brooklyn Technical High School.

After his graduation from CCNY, he became a member of the Communist Party (CP) and a member of the Teachers Union. He stated that he was unable to recall exact places of meeting while a member of the YCL and the CP and said he was unable to recall the names of persons who also belonged to the same units. He did recall that in the 1937 - 1938 period the meetings of the YCL took place at the homes of people in a fraternity house near CCNY and he also attended meetings in rented halls on the Lower East Side of New York.

He said that he was approached to join the CP in 1938 but did not recall the name of the person who approached him. He said he joined the Party under a pseudonym which he said he did not exactly recall but may have used the name of ADLER. He added that he may have used his own first name IRVING or the name HERB or HERBERT. He said also that he may have used the name VOLIN in his Party activity.

So far as the CP membership, after joining in 1938, is concerned, he said that the Party members were organized as an industrial group of teachers at the CCNY. He said that LEWIS BALAMUTH and MORRIS COHEN, teachers at CCNY, were in this group. He said that after he left CCNY and was teaching in the New York City high schools he was in a high school teachers group of Party members.

He declared that in this high school group, which was a small club, the meetings were held at the homes of members and that when he was teaching at Brooklyn Technical High School most of the members were affiliated with that school.

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He said that with the outbreak of the war in 1941 he made efforts to enlist and in March of 1942 was accepted as a cadet in the United States Army Air Force. He was first assigned to Scott Field and in November, 1942 was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant. He was later assigned to the Harvard - Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Electronics Training Center, and in May, 1943 he was assigned to the Radar Training Center at Boca Raton, Florida. He was later again assigned to the Boston area and in 1946 on his discharge from the Army he had the rank of Captain.

After being discharged from the Army in 1946, he returned to New York City and resided until 1951 in the Woodside and later the Astoria areas of Queens, New York City.

He again taught at CCNY in the years 1946 - 1948 meanwhile working for his Ph.D. at Columbia University, New York City. He received his Ph.D. from Columbia in 1948.

When he returned to New York City in 1946, he again established his affiliation with the CP in Queens but was not associated with any of the clubs in Queens. His affiliation was with small groups and not publicly with the larger clubs of the Party in that area. He said that in 1950 he went into the building business and built homes in the Floral Park and Great Neck areas of Long Island. He also taught a course in Chemistry at Brooklyn College in 1950.

He said that when he went into the building business in 1950 he discontinued any association with the CP and said this disassociation had been gradually growing over the previous couple of years.

He subsequently was employed by the Corning Glass Company, Corning, New York and by the General Electric Company in Syracuse, New York and also was employed by the

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Radio Corporation of America in Harrison, New Jersey, Sulton Industries, Merck and Company, and the Hazdon Laboratories, Newark, New Jersey. He then established his own business as a consultant in specific scientific fields.

WEINGARTEN declared that on entering the Army in 1942 he severed his connection with the CP and stated his only thoughts while he was in the Army Air Force was of the necessity to win the war and pride in the work he was doing for the Government. He stated he had no connections of any kind with the Party during this period.

He declared that after the war he never worked on any material of a classified nature and specifically avoided such work. He declared that he executed personnel security questionnaires with the Radio Corporation of America in 1950, at Merck and Company in 1953, and the Hazdon Laboratories about 1961 and did not mention therein his YCL or CP membership. He stated that he received clearances but did not work on any classified material.

He stated that he never furnished any information to any person he knew or had reason to believe was connected with the Soviet Government.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date 2/3/65

1. Dr. IRVING N. WEINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He stated that he knew STANLEY ROBERT RICH as a student at the College of the City of New York (CCNY) who graduated in Electrical Engineering at the same time he graduated from CCNY.

He stated he did not know RICH well at CCNY but that RICH was a member and attended meetings of the Young Communist League (YCL) at CCNY.

He said that he had met RICH in New York City on several occasions after graduation from CCNY in 1938. He believed that RICH had attended a party at the home of his, WEINGARTEN's, wife before the WEINGARTENS were married. He believed that RICH attended this party since WEINGARTEN's wife and girls whom RICH knew attended Hunter College in New York City.

He declared that sometime in the spring of 1943 he met STANLEY RICH in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and he believed this original meeting was a chance meeting somewhere around Harvard Square in Cambridge, Massachusetts. He said that RICH was a civilian and employed at the Harvard Underwater Sound Laboratory.

He said that he and RICH and others associated together in the spring of 1943 occasionally had dinners in the evening.

He said that in May of 1943 just shortly before he was transferred to Boca Raton, Florida he had dinner in a restaurant in Boston with RICH and a group of others. He said that his, WEINGARTEN's, wife was present on this occasion. He recalled that the restaurant was a Chinese restaurant but he could not recall its name or location. He

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said that after dinner when they were walking away from the restaurant he and RICH were separated from the others. He said RICH told him that he, RICH, could transmit information WEINGARTEN could give RICH to a Russian officer and asked WEINGARTEN would he give him some information for this purpose.

WEINGARTEN, at this point, stated that he was working on radar and said he had not told anybody what his subject was. He said he did not tell RICH he was working on radar.

WEINGARTEN said he asked RICH how RICH knew that anything that he, WEINGARTEN, was working on was worthwhile, and RICH replied that WEINGARTEN could leave that to RICH to decide.

WEINGARTEN said that he replied in the affirmative to RICH's request. He said that he wanted to know how far this would go and what would happen thereafter.

WEINGARTEN declared that RICH had the reputation of being a big talker. He said that just after this he and RICH departed from each other, and he never saw or heard from RICH again.

WEINGARTEN stated that this matter had bothered him for many years.

He stated that on several occasions he had looked up professional directories and had been unable to locate RICH and did not know where he is or has been located.

He asserted that he had never told anyone about this approach by RICH to him but said that in 1946 when he was moving from the Boston area to New York City he asked the person who took over his apartment and who he knew to be connected with the CP whether the CP had authorized any other persons in the Party to ask

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members for information such as RICH had asked him. He did not on that occasion mention RICH's name or any details of the incident.

He said he had not reported this incident to his authorities in the Army.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

2/19/65

Date

Dr. IRVING R. WEINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street,
New York, New York, advised as follows:

He recalled that some time after February, 1937, and certainly before 1940, he was present at a party with STANLEY RICH. He stated that this party was held in New York City and was at the home of RHODA SERASHUN (phonetic). He said that RHODA SERASHUN subsequently married EDDIE MAIDES who had also gone to City College of New York (CCNY). He said at this party, probably after his graduation in 1938, he recalls that RICH was talking about what WEINGARTEN later knew as radar, and was also mentioning what WEINGARTEN later ascertained to be a degaussing process.

WEINGARTEN said that he did not recall where RICH was working at the time but thought that it was strange that anyone would mention these matters at a party and in the hearing of other people.

WEINGARTEN stated that with regard to the occasion in Cambridge, Massachusetts, in May, 1943, when RICH told him he could transmit information to a Russian officer, this occasion was after a dinner. He recalled that the dinner was probably a farewell dinner as his group of Army Air Force officers had completed their course at Harvard - MIT and were going to other assignments. He said he did not recall how many were at this particular dinner which took place in a Chinese restaurant in Boston, but believed that First Lieutenant ADRIAN BLUMENFELD and his wife BEA were present. He also believed that CRAIG REYNOLDS, a Signal Corps Officer and his wife were present at the dinner. He said that in addition to RICH the only other civilian

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present was one GOLDVIELD, whose first name WEINGARTEN did not mention. He said GOLDVIELD had attended City College and was in some kind of a business in the Boston area at the time. He stated that GOLDVIELD is now located in the Plainfield, New Jersey, area. WEINGARTEN remarked without elaboration that RICH and GOLDVIELD were the only "leftists" at the party.

He stated that he recalled that RICH borrowed \$1.00 from him at this dinner and has Meyer paid him back.

He said that RICH prefaced their private conversation, at which nobody else but RICH and himself were present, with a remark that he had something special he wanted to talk to MECH about.

WEINGARTEN said that he had seen some Russian officers on the Boston streets in that time and understood that they were attached to the Watertown Arsenal there. He said he thought first when RICH mentioned that he could transmit information to a Russian officer that these were the persons meant.

He declared that he had been officially advised while staying at Harvard - MIT on radar that all the equipment on which they were working had already been officially given to the Russians.

He reiterated that after the conversation with RICH he had never been contacted by RICH or anyone else concerning this matter that he had discussed with RICH and his affirmative reply to RICH's query.

He advised that he returned to the Boston area in 1944 and remained there as an Air Force officer until 1946, but that he made no attempt either then or at any time to get in touch with RICH or to find out where RICH was located. He said that he had no indication that RICH directly or indirectly had ever looked for him. He said that he had subsequently seen GOLDVIELD in the Plainfield area in New Jersey.

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WEINGARTEN said that he was unable to place the date of this contact with RICH other than it occurred in May, 1943, and shortly before his transfer to Boss Haton. He said that he was unable to recall the name or location of the restaurant in which the dinner was held.

WEINGARTEN said that RICH may have been living alone during this period. He reiterated that he did not know whether RICH was married at this time and stated that no woman was with RICH on the occasion of the dinner.

With reference to his ever mentioning his conversation with RICH in 1943, WEINGARTEN stated that he mentioned it to EDDIE MAIDUS in a very veiled manner and without mentioning RICH's name. WEINGARTEN said he, in hypothetical terms, asked MAIDUS a question to the effect whether the Communist Party ever asked its members for information on confidential matters and what a person should respond if so asked. He said that MAIDUS indicated that this would be a decision for the individual to decide.

WEINGARTEN did not place the time of his conversation with MAIDUS except to state that it occurred after World War II.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Dr. IRVING S. WEINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He stated that he knew JOSEPH STEIGMAN who was a physical chemist and affiliated with the Brooklyn Poly Technic Institute.

He said that he knew STEIGMAN from his pre-World War II studies at Columbia University. He said that he again met him in the post war years possibly at either Columbia University or City College of New York (CCNY). He said that he and his wife had visited STEIGMAN and his wife on at least one occasion when STEIGMAN was residing near Columbia University. He recalled that his wife and he did not care for STEIGMAN's wife. He said that in 1950 STEIGMAN had arranged an interview for WEINGARTEN at Brooklyn Poly Technic Institute when WEINGARTEN tried to get a job as a teacher, but WEINGARTEN never received the position. WEINGARTEN stated that he had never known STEIGMAN from any Communist Party connection, but that STEIGMAN was in the Teacher's union and he "acted" as a Communist and also spoke like a Communist. WEINGARTEN said that he could tell STEIGMAN was a Communist from his actions and speech, but that he did not know STEIGMAN in any Communist Party capacity. WEINGARTEN did not elaborate on this.

He stated that while he was in the building business he met STEIGMAN at a party in Great Neck, New York. The party took place in the home of BOB SCHWARTZ and JERRY KOGIN. He said that KOGIN had received his Ph.D. from Columbia.

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WEINGARTEN stated that STRICKLY had always pressured him to get back into the field of science from the building business.

WEINGARTEN declared that STRICKLY was a "leech" and in explanation of the use of this term recalled that while he was in the building business STRICKLY called him and obtain from him several lengths of pipe and did not pay for it.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date 2/2/65

Dr. IRVING R. WHINARIZ, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He stated that in his group in the Young Communist League (YCL) at the College of the City of New York in the years of 1935 - 1936, in addition to MORTON SOBELL, MATHAN SUSMAN, and JULIUS ROSENBERG were LEO SAUBERMAN, HENRY SHOLLEY, and one FOGELSKY, whose first name he said he could not recall.

He said that meetings of the YCL when he was at City College in the period he attended the college were sometimes held at the Kappa Kappa House which had the nickname of the Karl Marx House. Other meetings were held on the lower east side and these were larger and more general meetings. He said he could not recall the locations of these meetings on the lower east side of New York City.

With relation to a service in the Army Air Corps, he stated that after he left Cambridge, Massachusetts, where he was attached to the Harvard - Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Electronics Training Center, he went to an Air Force installation at Boca Raton, Florida. He was there for about nine months and was transferred back to the Boston area about March 17, 1944. He remained in the Boston area with the Air Force from March, 1944, until his discharge from the United States Army Air Force in 1946. This assignment he said was generally in a liaison capacity with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and while in this capacity he continued to work on radar. He said that as a result of his work in this field he received a commendation

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from the Air Corps for his work on radar with particular reference to a study of how, through radar, there could be a distinguishing between Japanese airplanes and the B-29's of the American Air Force. He said that the problem existed in the Pacific war, particularly in its final stages, as to how Japanese planes could be distinguished from American airplanes on radar, and he said his work in distinguishing these planes was based on the propeller tip velocity of the B-29's which distinguished them from any other plane. In 1945 he was assigned to take one of the newest radar machines to the Pacific area for the stages of the war against Japan, but that with the dropping of the atomic bomb and the arrival of VJ Day, this assignment was cancelled and he remained in Boston until discharged.

With regard to his re-entrance into the Communist Party in Queens, New York City, in 1946, he stated that this had come about through the solicitation of a man and woman named BRODSKY who were neighbors of the WEINGARTENs in Woodside, New York.

He named the BRODSKYs as GEORGE and ROSE BRODSKY and added that BRODSKY was a printer and his wife, ROSE, was a social worker connected with the Jewish Community Services in Jamaica, Queens.

He said that the BRODSKYs later resided in Long Beach, Long Island, and still later in Forest Hills, Queens.

He said that the association with the BRODSKYs became to him an unpleasant one and he later used the phrase "pursued" in describing the efforts of BRODSKY to maintain contact with him. He said he had last seen the BRODSKYs when they made an automobile trip to Elmira, New York, and were house guests of WEINGARTEN at the time he was employed by the Corning Glass Works in Corning, New York, in the period of 1953 to 1955.

WEINGARTEN indicated a reluctance to explain his relationship with the BRODSKYs and their pursuit of him.

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With relation to the same period of time, that is 1946 to 1950, when he resided in Woodside and Astoria, Queens, he said that one of the members of the Communist group with which he was affiliated was one KAPTEL whose first name he did not mention, but who was a Professor of English at Queens College.

WEINGARTEN indicated he could not remember the other members of this Communist group and stated that the group was merely a conversational group discussing the current issues. He said all of the members of the group were "intellectuals."

WEINGARTEN, in discussing this phase, mentioned that one "fellow" in the group had been formerly in the Army in decoding and cryptanalysis work.

WEINGARTEN stated that after he received his Ph D at Columbia in June of 1948, he remained at Columbia University until June of 1949, being attached to the Columbia Radiation Laboratory.

He said that on the recommendation of Professor ISIDORE RABI he helped the new Government of Israel in their radar problems and the purchase of surplus United States radar equipment for use in the Israel Arab war. He declared that this equipment was not of a classified nature.

He said that he had received an invitation at that time to go to Israel and live there but declined this invitation.

He said that from 1949 to 1950 he was employed with the Taylor and Cooper Company in New York City in a research capacity.

In the spring of 1950 he said he went into the building business and for the next three years was engaged in the building of homes on Long Island. He said that he went into this business in order to make money.

Date 2/4/65

Mr. DAVID B. WEINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He said that prior to the approach by STANLEY RICH to him for information for the Soviets, he had met RICH in Cambridge, Massachusetts, about three or four times.

He said he knew nothing more concerning RICH as a Communist except that RICH had been a member of the YCL at City College of New York (CCNY).

He said that he assumed that RICH's approach to him for information was based on the fact that RICH knew that he had been a Communist. He said that there had been no preliminary approach by RICH or any other person for information and that the proposition of RICH was "out of the blue".

He reiterated that he could not place the time and place of RICH's proposition to him beyond that it was in May of 1943, and after a dinner in which several people were present, but nobody was present except RICH and himself when RICH asked him if he would furnish information to him. He said that after he hesitated and finally answered RICH's query affirmatively, RICH said something to the effect that somebody would be in touch with WEINGARTEN or that WEINGARTEN would hear from RICH. He said that there was no mention of any payment for the information. He said that RICH made his approach in a serious manner and that while he did not know what to make of it, he assumed the proposition was seriously made. He said that he received no information from RICH that any other individual was supplying information to RICH. He said that GOLDFIELD, who had been present at the dinner, was not present at the time of his conversation with RICH and he did not believe that any other person had overheard their conversation. He said he did not know how well RICH and GOLDFIELD knew each other except that they had known of each other since their student days at CCNY.

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WEINGARTEN stated that he definitely recalled that RICH had borrowed a dollar from him at the time of the dinner allegedly on the ground that RICH was short of money. He said that there was no provision made for a specific meeting or for the arrangement of some signal for a future meeting.

He added that he had never tried to get in touch with RICH again and that RICH, to his knowledge, had never tried to get in touch with WEINGARTEN. He said that he was never approached at any other time for information regarding his work or his knowledge, by any person connected with the Communists, or anyone connected with the Russians.

He said that he had never mentioned the matter of RICH's conversation with him to anyone but his wife, and in very veiled terms, to two other persons. He identified one of these persons as NANNY BLUM who later became the District Organizer for the Communist Party (CP) in the Boston Area. He said that his exchange of apartments with NANNY BLUM, when BLUM took over his apartment in Dorchester, Massachusetts and he took over BLUM's apartment in Woodside, New York, was not arranged through any Communist auspices. He said that his parents had advertised in "The New York Times" for an apartment in the New York City Area for he and his wife, somewhere around January, 1946, and a response to this advertisement was received by him from BLUM. He said that when he met BLUM and BLUM admitted being a Communist in a higher capacity, that he asked BLUM whether a Communist would ever be used for espionage. He said that BLUM answered him, that of course this was out of the question. He denied meeting BLUM at any time after the exchange of apartments in January, 1946.

WEINGARTEN stated that he had also mentioned the RICH approach to him without specific mention of the name of the man or other circumstances, to KIDIE NAIDUS. He explained that he knew he had known NAIDUS from the 71st Wood Section of Manhattan before the war, and that his wife and NAIDUS' wife were known to each other. He said that NAIDUS had been in the YCL at CCNY though he was several years older than he, WEINGARTEN, was. He said that NAIDUS was a chemist and had worked for the government in some civil service job before the war. He said that NAIDUS was not in the military service. He said that in response to a question to NAIDUS as to what a Communist would do if he were asked for espionage

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information, MAIDUS replied that the answer to this question would be a personal one and would depend on the individual of whom it was asked. WEINGARTEN said he never pursued this discussion with MAIDUS and said that the conversation he had with MAIDUS was in about 1946 or just after World War II.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date: 1/8/65

Dr. IRVING R. WINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He said that after his graduation from the College of the City of New York (CCNY), he stayed on the staff at CCNY for another year, meanwhile doing his graduate work at Columbia University.

He said that it was in this period that he joined the Communist Party (CP) and also became affiliated with the Teacher's Union. He said that he was unable to differentiate at this time between the two groups, though almost all the Chemistry staff at CCNY belonged to the Teacher's Union, that those who belonged to the CP were a smaller group and not all of the members of the Teacher's Union belonged to the CP. He said he did not recall who sponsored him into the CP and said he did not recall ever having a membership book. He said he also did not recall meetings of the CP unit to which he belonged, except that he had a recollection of a meeting at the home of MORRIS SCHAFFER, who was later dismissed from CCNY. He said that other persons at CCNY who were Communists, though he did not meet them at meetings, were MORRIS S. COHEN and SID EISENBERGER. He said his memory was vague as to any other members of the unit to which he belonged or of meetings of this unit. WINGARTEN said that the reasons for his joining the CP were based on opposition to HITLER's Germany, to anti-Semitism and the fact that employment opportunities were so restricted in the late 1930's.

He said that in 1939 he secured the job as a laboratory assistant at New Dorp High School and later, Brooklyn Technical High School. His union activities and CP membership continued in these positions.

With reference to the CP unit at Brooklyn Technical High School, he said that this group consisted of approximately 12 people, some of the group being the wives of the male teachers, and others, single women teachers.

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He said that he was unable to recall many specific meetings of this group or where they met except that they never met in his home as the apartment he and his wife then had in Greenwich Village was too small. He stated that the meetings were probably in the homes of other members in Brooklyn. He stated that he could not recall the names of the members of this group and could only recall that one of the members was a gymnasium teacher at Brooklyn Technical High School whose wife also taught physical education. The only other member he said he could recall was a man who taught either languages or history and who was a diabetic. He said that he believed that SWERDLOV (PH) was the name of the member who was a diabetic.

WEINGARTEN stated that his own wife, LENORE, was a member of the CP in this group but stated that she was only a member because he, WEINGARTEN, was a member. He said that his wife, at that time, was a correction officer working for the City of New York.

WEINGARTEN stated that he was unable to recall under what name or names he had joined the Party. He stated that he used the name of ADLER and VOLYN, but did not remember whether he used his own name of IRVING, with these names. He also stated he did not recall in which of his connections with the CP he had used either name. He said he did not remember making out any application for membership and said he paid his dues regularly but did not recall the amount, but believed that it was a very small amount of money.

He denied that he ever occupied an office in the Teacher's Union or in the CP, other than mere membership. He stated that he had never been Treasurer of the Teacher's Union.

WEINGARTEN said that he ceased connection with the CP after he had volunteered as an Air Force Cadet just after Pearl Harbor. He said he did not remember any final or farewell meeting of his CP unit even though they had been meeting every week.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date: 3/8/65

Dr. IRVING R. WEINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He first met JOSEPH STEIGMAN at Columbia University when both were working for graduate degree in chemistry. WEINGARTEN said that he intended to study with the same professor under whom STEIGMAN was doing his graduate work. He said that STEIGMAN was senior to him in their field of research, having been at Columbia for several years prior to the time that he started his studies there.

He said that the association with WEINGARTEN was at sporadic intervals up until about 1953.

He said that he had never met STEIGMAN organizationally in the Communist Party (CP) and did not know whether he was a member of the CP, but that through conversations with STEIGMAN he was of the opinion that STEIGMAN was a Communist.

He said that his relationship with STEIGMAN was a professional relationship but that on one occasion, probably after World War II, he and his wife were entertained at STEIGMAN's house by STEIGMAN and his wife.

He said that STEIGMAN talked like a Communist but that he did not ever remember discussing Communist ideas or actions with STEIGMAN. He added that STEIGMAN never approached him for membership in the CP or for any information that he might possess.

He said he also recalled that when he was with the Teller and Cooper Company, that STEIGMAN arranged an appointment for him at Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute for a teaching position there. WEINGARTEN said he did not secure the position at Brooklyn Polytechnical Institute. He recalled that when he left the Teller and Cooper Company, he recommended to the company that STEIGMAN be retained as a consultant on any problems they had. He said he did not know whether this consultant's job for STEIGMAN ever materialized.

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WRINGARTEN said that STRIGMAN always pressured him into remaining in the academic field and this caused a strain in their relationship which ceased when STRIGMAN asked and received of WRINGARTEN some lengths of plumbing pipe when WRINGARTEN was in the building industry from about 1950 to 1953.

Doctor IRVING M. WEINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He advised that he met GEORGE and ROSE BRODSKY in 1946, when he moved into his apartment in Woodside, Queens, New York. This apartment had been occupied by EMANUEL BLUM, with whom he exchanged his apartment in the Boston area. He said that BRODSKY visited him as he was a neighbor on the same street in Woodside, Queens.

He said that he never had any official connection in the Communist Party with BRODSKY and did not know BRODSKY as a Communist from any organizational connection. He said that BRODSKY spoke like a Communist and spoke of Communists he had known. Weingarten said that he did not recall, at this time, the names of Communists whom BRODSKY knew and spoke about.

He said that BRODSKY was a printer and artist but was employed as a proofreader in connection with the newspaper industry. He said that Mrs. BRODSKY was a social worker in connection with a Jewish Social Work Organization in Queens and was very interested in the WEINGARTEN's infant son DONALD. With reference to his rejoining the Communist Party in 1946, WEINGARTEN stated that he did not recall how his rejoining the party was accomplished or through whom it was made. He said he did not think that GEORGE BRODSKY had accomplished this for him. He said he did not recall whether his rejoining the Communist Party came from the neighborhood or from the college group at the City College of New York City where he started to teach in 1946. He also attended courses at Columbia University for his PH.D.

He said that the association with BRODSKY was a social connection and continued over the years. The BRODSKYS, he said, had moved from Woodside, Queens, to Long Beach, Long Island, and back to Forest Hills, Queens, and endeavored to continue their association with WEINGARTEN. He said that BRODSKY, to his recollection, did not pressure him to continue in the Communist Party or ever solicit from him information of any type concerning his scientific work.

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He denied that BRODSKY introduced him to anyone who had questioned him concerning his work.

He said that the last time he saw the BRODSKYS was when he was employed at the Corning Glass Company, Elms, New York. He said that it was possible in 1954, during the warm weather, that the BRODSKYS arrived at his home and stayed over night. He said he did not know whether the BRODSKYS may have visited Canada on this occasion and during their visit did not mention anything concerning connections with the Soviet Union and they engaged in no Political discussion during the visit. He said he did not recall whether he had discussed with BRODSKY the use of people with Communist affiliation for Russian espionage, but said he possibly may have done so without specific references to any particular set of facts or specific person. He said that the association with the BRODSKYS became personally distasteful to him and said that the social relationship was broken off because of that.

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FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Dr. IRVING R. WEINGARTEN, 675 Academy Street, New York, New York, advised as follows:

He said that he had known JOSEPH GOLDFIELD at the College of the City of New York (CCNY) when they were at school there together. He said he had known GOLDFIELD as a member of the YCL but said he did not remember in which engineering specialty GOLDFIELD had graduated. He said that after graduation from CCNY he had no special social connection with GOLDFIELD and the last time he recalled meeting GOLDFIELD was in Boston, Massachusetts in 1943 when WEINGARTEN was an Air Force Cadet at the Harvard-MIT Naval Training Center. He said he did not recall how he met GOLDFIELD in Cambridge in 1943 and said he possibly met him accidentally on the street. He said he did not recall what GOLDFIELD's employment was in Cambridge but that GOLDFIELD was not in the military service. He said GOLDFIELD may have been associated with some research laboratory in the Boston area. He recalled that GOLDFIELD's wife was present with him at the time, but he did not recall where they lived or any visits made to their home. He said possibly he had met GOLDFIELD three or four times during the spring of 1943 in Cambridge. He said that he knew nothing more of any Communist Party (CP) membership or activities on the part of GOLDFIELD other than his membership in the YCL at CCNY.

He said that GOLDFIELD has been living in Plainfield, New Jersey, where he and WEINGARTEN used to meet occasionally when WEINGARTEN resided there. He said that GOLDFIELD's son and his own son had attended Plainfield High School together. GOLDFIELD, he said, was working at the Johns Manville Company in New Jersey.

STANLEY ROBERT RICH

RICH was interviewed at Hartford, Connecticut, on August 28, 1950, by Special Agents (SA) LEO FRYDKIN and JOHN HAININGTON. He stated he engaged in "leftist activities" at College of the City of New York, from which he graduated in 1938, and participated in many student rallies such as advocating aid for Loyalist Spain and maintenance of academic freedom. He said he eventually became president of the College of the City of New York (CCNY) Tech Council and in this capacity spoke for Loyalist Spain at a rally conducted by the Young Communist League (YCL).

On September 5, 1950, RICH was reinterviewed by SAs EDWARD R. WHELAN and WILLIAM H. BOYD, JR. He stated that at CCNY he became a member of the Steinmetz Club, this organization became affiliated with the YCL and a unit of that organization. He said he attended open meetings and those closed to members only but denied he was an officer of the organization. He denied ever having joined the Communist Party (CP) or attended a meeting of that organization. He stated he was not a leading functionary in the YCL. He recalled attendance at closed meetings of the YCL of JULIUS ROSENBERG, MORTON SOBELL, RAYE LITCHEE, WILLIAM DANIELER and NATHAN BUSHMAN. He said that WILLIAM KUTNERFEL was possibly observed by him at closed meetings of the YCL but could not be definite on that point.

JOSEPH BA'TULL STEIGMAN

STEIGMAN testified before the Internal Security Subcommittee of the Committee of the Judiciary of the United States Senate on May 21, 1953. He testified that he was an instructor in chemistry at CCNY from 1939 to 1942, that he received his Ph.D. in chemistry from Columbia University in 1941 and had been on the faculty of Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute since 1948.

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STEIGMAN declined to answer whether he had attended closed meetings of the CP or whether he had been a member of the CP when he graduated from Columbia University on the ground of the first, fifth and sixth amendments to the Constitution.

Dr. LEWIS BALAMUTH testified before the same Subcommittee on May 12, 1953, that STEIGMAN had been a member of the CP Unit at CCNY. BALAMUTH formerly was on the faculty at CCNY.

JOSEPH GOLDFIELD

As set forth above, NATHAN SUSSMAN identified JOSEPH GOLDFIELD, of the CCNY, class of 1939 as Educational Director of the Steinmetz Club at CCNY.

MARTIN GOLDFIELD, brother of JOSEPH GOLDFIELD, furnished a signed statement to Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on March 5, 1956. He admitted membership in the YCL from 1936 to 1941 and registration with the CP in the Boston area in 1945. MARTIN GOLDFIELD advised that his brother, JOSEPH GOLDFIELD had been a member of the CP.

NY T-1 advised that JOSEPH GOLDFIELD 1699 Cambridge Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, was listed as a member of the Henry Thoreau Branch of the Communist Political Association as of November 23, 1944. His occupation was listed as chemist-Government.

[redacted] Harlow Real Estate Agency, Harvard Square, Cambridge, Massachusetts in 1946 advised that JOSEPH GOLDFIELD resided at 1699 Cambridge Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts from June 1, 1943 to January 1, 1945, and had formerly resided at 68 Kirkland Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts. His business was listed as a research associate at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

JOSEPH GOLDFELD, 43 Myrtle Avenue, North Plainfield, New Jersey, was interviewed on December 2, 1954 by SAs ROBERT J. KILMAN and NORMAN A. HENRICKS. GOLDFELD advised he graduated from CCNY in 1938. He said he recalled the name of NATHAN SUSSMAN but could not definitely associate SUSSMAN with CCNY. He commented that although he recalled the name of SUSSMAN, he could not associate him with any place in particular nor could he advise why SUSSMAN's name was familiar to him.

GEORGE BRODSKY
ROSE BRODSKY

NY T-2 advised in 1953 that GEORGE BRODSKY resided at 41-65 54th Street, Queens, New York, in 1942 and moved from that address in late 1946 or early 1947.

Records of the Board of Elections, Queens, New York, show that in 1953, ROSE BRODSKY, was employed as a social worker with Jewish Community Service, Jamaica, New York.

NY T-3 on March 5, 1954, identified GEORGE BRODSKY as having served as a Political Commissar with the GEORGE WASHINGTON Brigade in the Spanish Civil War.

EMANUEL BLUM also known as
HARRY BLUM

NY T-4 advised in December, 1945, that BLUM was President of the Queens County CP.

NY T-5 advised on December 7, 1945 that BLUM resided at 43-18 54th Street, Woodside, Queens, New York.

NY 105-71796

NY T-6 advised in early 1946, that the New
England headquarters of the CP, Boston, had a new
District organizer by the name of MANNY ELMI.

OSCAR HAMILTON SHAPTEL

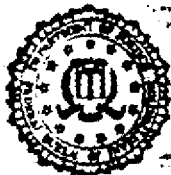
NY T-7 advised on February 26, 1953 that SHAPTEL
was known to the source as a member of the CP from 1938 to
1941.

Dr. JOSEPH IUCARDO, Assistant Professor,
Art Department, Queens College in 1955 advised that prior to
1943, SHAPTEL was outspoken in his pro-Communist views and
once admitted at a faculty meeting that he was a member of
the CP.

SHAPTEL was on the staff of Queens College,
Flushing, New York, and was employed as an instructor in
the English Department of the College until February 18, 1953,
when he was suspended. He was later discharged due to his refusal
to answer questions concerning his alleged CP affiliations before
the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on
February 13, 1953.

JULIUS ROSENBERG
MORTON SOBELL

ROSENBERG and SOBELL were convicted of conspiracy
to commit espionage against the United States in the Federal
Court, Southern District of New York, in 1951. ROSENBERG
was sentenced to death in April, 1951, and executed on
June 19, 1953. SOBELL on April 5, 1951, was sentenced to
a term of 30 years in Federal Prison.
