Anti-Israel draft at the U.N.

UNITED NATIONS (Reuter). Eighteen countries submitted a resolution to the General Assembly on Tuesday night calling on all states to withhold assistance to Israel which would enable it to 'sustain its occupation" of Arab territories,

They also proposed that the 132nation Assembly request the Sec-urity Council to take "all appro-priate steps" to obtain the full, speedy implementation of the Counch's Resolution 242, which called for Israeli withdrawal from occupied territories and end to Arab belligerency.

The draft would have the Assembly declare the inadmissibility of the acquisition of territories by

force and invite Israel to declare publicly its "adherence to the prin-ciple of non-annexation of territothrough the use of force."

All states would be recommended to refrain from recognizing any changes carried out by Israel in the physical or demographic composition of the occupied lands.

The Assembly is expected to vote on the resolution before the end of this week.

# Costa Rica backs Israel, **President** says

SAN JOSE. - Costa Rica supports Israel in the Middle East conflict, Jose Figueres, the President of Costa Rica, told Israel Foreign Minister Abba Eban here yesterday. The two held a lengthy meeting in the President's office.

Mr. Figueres said he feels an affinity to Israel, both as President of Costa Rica and as the head of the Social Democratic Party, which is a sister member of Israel's Lahour Party in the Socialist International.

The President also recalled his meetings with Prime Minister Golda Meir and his three visits to Israel. Mr. Eban is in Costa Rica on an official visit to the government and will leave for Israel via the U.S. today.

The Israel Minister also met with Costa Rica's Minister of Agriculture on the possibility of Israel aid in developing dairy farming in that country's southern region, which borders on Panama.



# Third of land in Egypt is salt-affected

Egypt's seven million acres of arable land is salt-affected, representatives of 31 countries participat-ing in an international symposium on salt-affected land were told on Tuesday.

said Egypt spent \$2,800m. on reclaiming land and combating saline ground over the past 10 years. An equal amount will be spent in the coming 10 years, he added.

The three-day conference, sponsored by the International Society of Social Sciences headquartered in Amsterdam, opened Monday to discuss 76 research papers on how to combat saline land problems.

Conference Chairman Hassan Hamdy, of Egypt, said Egypt has been fighting saline land with a special drainage system which lowers ground water level to dry the soll and eliminate salt.

The U.S. Britain, France, West Germany, East Germany, Italy and the Soviet Union are also participating in the symposium.




