MOSCOW (AP). — Russia's border dispute with China erupted in a fierce gun hattle last month when five Soviet soldiers and several Russian civilians were kil-led in a clash with Chinese mau-rauders who crossed into Soviet Karakhstan, according to a confi-dential account quoted by Western diplomatic sources here yesterday.

Cabinet adopts

Budget of over

IL20,000m.

The Cabinet yesterday approved a 1973/74 Budget of more than IL20,000m. — bigger than expected. Discussion lasted only some 90 minutes and the vote was unanimous. Ministers expressed their

gratification that adequate provision was made for education, health and social welfare, which suggests that Finance Minister Pinhas Sapir's estimates have been pruned less drastically than earlier

Tax revenue was scheduled to be IL10,365m, this year, but actual receipts will be more than H.300m. higher, reaching IL10,700m.

Tax revenue

Next year, they will bring in over IL12,500m. — despite a loss of IL360m. due to a proposed cut in income tax. The marginal rate of tax plus compulsory loan, reduced from 80 to 75 per cent last April, will be sliced further

to 70 per cent next April.

The five per cent cut will apply all the way down the line, and will be greater still at the bottom of the scale. Thus a married man with two children will pay no tax on income up to IL600 a month, as against IL438 today. A married man with four children will be tax-free up to an income of IL800 a month.



THE fog - or smokescreen surrounding the fate of Hitler's deputy, Martin Bormann, has exercised imaginations since the number-two Nazi was last seen in May 1945, as the Russians were entering Berlin.



Later in his series Farago for some reason changes the name to the "Blue Falcons." headed by a Yehuda Shimoni. No doubt whoever fabricated Farago's "documents" had remembered that press reports at the time of Eichmann's capture mentioned this as the name of one of Eichmann's captors.

The truth is that Yebuda Shi-

moni, then as now a senior El Al official, handled the special El Al flight arranged to bring the Israel delegation to Argentina's 150th anniversary celebrations, held at the time of the capture. Similarly, the late Dr. Fritz Bauer's known role in the discovery of Eichmann enabled the document forgers to garnish their creation with his name. Furthermore, the Israeli task force did not carry Israeli passports, and it was impossible to identify them as Israeli citizens. Only a few of them stayed at hotels, and then only for part of their time in Argentina. And there was never more than one Israeli

agent at a given hotel, so that it is hard to see how they could have made themselves conspicuous. to the Israeli task force which the "secret dossier" has visiting Argentina in 1957, this in truth amounted to one man, whose sole task was to check out what proved to be a false lead. And this 1957 mission was openly reported later.


Even Farago's description of the capture is incorrect. Whoever made up his documents simply did not know how it was done. They were unaware that there were two cars on the spot, not one, and that the cars were standing, not moving. After the capture Eichman was taken not to a farm, but to another sort of place. The plane bearing him took off not at 5.52 p.m. but at five minutes after midnight on the next day, May 21, 1960. Neither Abba Eban nor Meir Zorea were on hoard; both had come to Buenos Aires on the El Al plane. but they returned to Israel by other







BANK SECRECY FAR FROM TOTAL

HOW secret are bank secrets in Israel? It is not easy to answer this simple question, but one thing is clear - it is far from total. Most citizens do not like other people or the authorities to know too many details about their financial affairs. "Other people" may include a spouse, children, relations; but as a rule it means business friends and competitors. The au-thorities concerned are first and foremost, of course, income tax

Banks do their best to assure their clients that nobody needs to know that they have money deposited. It doesn't even have to be known that they are cus-

In my native Honard, many banks had a secret side entrance, so that clients could enter the premises unseen. Nowadays, however, there is no longer any real bank secrecy in Holland, as the fiscal authorities have obtained the right to scrutinize the books

In most countries of the world. bank secrecy, though formally still recognized, has in practice become rather doubtful. In Europe, Switzerland is the only country which takes strong mea-sures — to the extent of legal action — to uphold the bank secrecy law which has brought so many foreign deposits to this haven of flight capital.

In Israel, nobody seems to have any inhibitions about entering a bank, but the average customer does not like other people to know how much money he keeps in his account. His bank manager will usually tell him that this is a confidential matter. The bank will not give any information about their customers, without their prior knowledge and consent, to third parties, including, it is said, government or

What does this kind of secrecy amount to? Have all these precautions any real value? No bank, of course, will of its own volition supply information about the accounts of its customers to third parties; but much could still be done, by improving simple techniques, to ensure that accidents do not happen. The slop-py practice of sending state-ments in badly sealed envelopes or, worse still, in envelopes closed with a staple, makes it all too easy for a curious apartment-house to take a pack of a house tenant to take a peek at a neighbour's account. This annoyance, which is more important than is usually assumed, could easily be prevented.

Supplying knowledge about the financial situation of its customers is, of course, one of the tasks of the banking system. It enables businessmen to receive an expert opinion about the credit worthiness of the man or the firm they are dealing with. It is, however, a rule that this infor-mation should only be supplied with the authorization of the customer concerned. But there are occasions when this information is handed out by a bank clerk to another customer without the consent of an account holder.
A more rigid application of the rules could stop this leakage.

More serious is an agreement that seems to have been operative for several years, whereby banks will give information to the fiscal authorities about a limited number of bank accounts of firms persons whose tax assessments are "under investigation." Although this hole in the rule "no information to the authorities" is admittedly a tiny one so far, it nevertheless exists.



A TIMELY TOURISM LAW

AS Israel prepares for the big-gest tourist influx in its history, on the occasion of the State's 25th anniversary cele-brations, the Minister of Tourism today tables in the Knesset a much-needed law on tourist services.

One of the fastest growing industries in Israel, tourism has earned some \$225m. from almost 750,000 visitors in the course of 1972, an increase over last year of about 25 per cent despite the slow-down in July and August. In addition to its important economic benefits, this sector has also done much to create good-will for Israel.

But it is no secret that the growth in the number of over-seas visitors has brought with it a marked rise in the number of complaints on the standards and services of some hotels, restaurants, travel agencies, guides and transport companies. Reports of malpractice have become too frequent. Until now, it was almost impossible to deal effectively with most of them for lack of appropriate legal ma-chinery. Tourism has been gov-erned by a series of Mandatory ordinances and Israeli regula-tions which lack teeth and whose enforcement is a long and costly procedure.

Israel is now competing for tourists with the most sophisti-cated and experienced countries of Europe and the Mediterranean. The attraction of religious sites and the special atmosphere and spirit of this country can-not be made to compensate for overcharging and a purely com-mercial attitude towards visitors.

The majority of those involved in the tourist trade are a credit to their profession and to the country. But a small minority has, on occasion, given Israel a bad name among disappointed tourists. It is against those who break the rules, and in order to protect the reputation of the majority, that the Ministry of Tourism has finally put together the ordinances and regulations governing tourist services.

Under the guidance of Minister Moshe Kol much thought has gone into the bill. It has been carefully drafted by a team of Ministry specialists with the advice of hoteliers, restaurant owners, travel agents and guides. It will provide a set of rules for the various services, determine the professional quali-fications of those engaged in them, insist on proper display of prices and establish machinery to investigate complaints and punish those found guilty. The creation of various advisory committees proposed in the law. will insure the cooperation of the tourist industry in its im-

With one million tourists expected in 1973, Knesset Members, who have been demanding such legislation since the creation of the Tourism Ministry in 1964, would be wise to act upon the law quickly.
