SOME people here have told me that one of the reasons for not wanting to retain the occupied territories is the inadvisability of having an excessively important minority in a national state. In Canada nearly 30 per cent of the population is of French origin. While this has contributed, most believe, to the richness of the Canadian social fabric, it has given rise to some po-litical difficulties which culminated in the widely publicized terrorist activities of October, 1970, Why?

For numerous reasons, Frenchspeaking Canadians had until recently kept to themselves, taking a limited part in public life. of 1971 public consumption was 21 per cent bigger than in the corresponding period in 1970, it was 20 per cent smaller in the second half of 1971. As a result, the year's total was only a fraction the 1970 amount in real terms. This development has, incidentally, cuts in defence budgets were carried out, and despite sizeable additions to housing and welfare spending. One may therefore expect this trend to continue - unless, of course, it reflects no more than the delay in supply of Phantom planes, should be rectified in 1972.

Private consumption

In any case, private consumption last year moved in a direction exactly opposite to that of public consumption. Its annual increase was only 4.5 per cent less than originally expected (though more than in 1970, when average consumption per capita increased hardly at all). But the increment was only 2 per cent in the first half of the year, and 7 per cent in the second. The pattern of the (annual) increase was again typical for an affluent society. While in 1970 the fiscal squeeze forced consumers to reduce spending for a number of items, such as entertainment, travel, and household equipment, this was not the case in 1971. Only spending on household (including furniture) continued to drop after the 1968 upsurge due to mass acquisition of television sets. But spending on entertainment, travel, household maintenance, personal care, and mits services continued to rise substantially. Spending on motor vehicles, which declined 36 per cent in 1970, was up 29 per cent last year. These trends are likely to persist in 1972, unless they are checked by next supportunity reliefs.

The resulting conversion of foreign exchange into pounds has by now replaced the public deficit as the main source of monetary expansion. The annual expansion of payment was about 26 per cent in 1971 — nearly double the 1970 rate - and almost four times the rate of real growth of our GNP. As a matter of fact, the GNP price level advanced 11 per cent in 1971, and most of this has taken place in the second part of the year. However, this price increase seems to be less than warranted by the overhang of liquidity now available for additional spending.

The association was formed at the insistence of doctors at local gov-ernment hospitals, who have been having difficulty persuading relatives of sick persons to donate blood because of a local superstition that persons donating their blood become impotent.

ASSASSINATION PLOT SMASHED IN CARACAS

CARACAS (Reuter). — Venezuelan security forces have smashed an urban guerrifia plot to assassinate some of the country's top military officials, senior military sources said

on Friday. The plan and a "death list" were uncovered during a raid on a sub-urban flat in which plain-clothes security men captured members of

a militant guerrilla cell.

The raid, at dusk on Friday, also yielded arms and urban terrorist plans as well as an elaborate list of commercial establishments in Caracas which sell and buy two-way radio systems.

The sources said the captured guerrilla cell was involved in the attack on a National Guard garrison at Ocumare del Tuy, 30 kms. east of here, last Tuesday. The assault was carried out by 20 guerrillas, wearing military uniforms, who tied and gagged the garrison sergeant and four soldiers and escaped with a large quantity of au-tomatic weapons and ammunition.

Four men held for Pierre heist, \$250,000 found

NEW YORK (Reuter). - Police and F.B.I. agents arrested four men in connection with the spectacular Hotel Pierre robbery here after breaking up an underworld sale of part of the loot.

City police commissioner Patrick Murphy announced Friday night after raids on two New York hotels that his men had cracked the case — one of the higgest robberies of its kind in New York's history with losses estimated at anything up to \$4m.

About \$250,000 worth of jewellery stolen last Sunday from the Hotel Pierre was recovered on Friday when police and F.B.L men stormed into the Summit Hotel. The raid smashed what Commissioner Murphy described as a "buying operation" meaning the thieves were disposing of loot to underworld buyers. A band of gunmen turned up at the Hotel Pierre early last Sunday posing as guests. They handcuffed 19 employees and guests before systematically rifling about 50 safe deposit boxes containing jewels,

money and other valuable Police are still seeking two men in connection with the robbery, and search warrants are to be executed in the search for the loot.

I.O.S. MOVE TO HOLLAND

The LOS, investment empire set up about ten years ago by Bernie Cornfeld, which collapsed re-cently, involving severe losses for Israeli investors, among many others, is moving part of its activities from Geneva to Amsterdam. (LO.S. is indirectly connected with the Netivei Neft enterprise through its affiliated company King's Resource Ltd. co-owner of Midbar Ltd., prospected for oil in Sinai.) The local authorities apparently

want to induce LO.S. to leave Switzerland because its continuous presence in Geneva has embarrassed the Swiss. No less than 200 lawsuits have been launched against LO.S., its directors and managers. Among the accused are Bernie Corn-feld himself, Ambassador James Roosevelt, son of the former American President, Erich Mende, a former West German Deputy Prime Minister, and many other well-known personalities who lent their names to LO.S., receiving in return substantial remunerations. Geneva judge Robert Pagan has declared that he expects to disentangle the I.O.S. affair in about a year.

I.O.S. meanwhile intends to transfer its customer service to Holland. Mr. Marvin Hoffman, senior vicepresident of LO.S., moves this month with a staff of 20-30 officials to Amsterdam, More departments are scheduled to follow.

Four Moslem pfigrims to Mecca died yesterday when their tender crashed into the rear of a cement mixer on the Jerusa-lem-Jericho road. The disaster brought to a total of eight the number of persons killed in traffic accidents. Sixteen persons were injured in accidents in the 36-hour period ending at press time last night.

Six other persons were seriously injured in the tender crash which occurred at Ma'ale Ha'Adumim, when the brakes apparently failed. The tender was carrying about ten Arab pilgrims from the Hebron area on their way to Mecca.

Begin may cut short London visit

By ERIC SILVER LONDON. - Menahem Begin said here last night he may cut short his visit to Britain and return to Israel, after the bookings for his main two public appearances were cancelled.

Mr. Begin, arrived in London yes-

terday amidst tight security and a flerce newspaper campaign.
Telephoned threats to the Royal

Garden Hotel, where Mr. Begin was to address a dinner last night, and to the Central Hall, Westminster, where he was to address a public meeting today, led the management of both venues to cancel the bookings.



WASHINGTON (AP). — Sudan, which broke diplomatic relations with the U.S. during the Six Day War, will soon upgrade its semiofficial diplomatic mission in Washington, David Newsom, the As-sistant Secretary of State for Af-



Expert dispels all doubt on J.F.K. killing

NEW YORK (Reuter). -- The first independent expert to study X-rays of President Kennedy taken after his killing said that they eliminate any doubt that Lee Harvey Oswald fired the fatsi shots, the "New York Times" reported yesterday. British Prime Minister Edward Heath, greets Shelkh Mujibur Rahman outside No. 10 Downing Street after

In a front-page article the newspaper said that Dr. John Lattimer, Chairman of the Department of Urology at Columbia University, New York, was allowed on Friday to examine the X-rays in the National Archives in Washington. The 65 photographs and X-rays taken during the post-mortem on President Kennedy are closely guarded at the archives at the request of the Kennedy family.

The "Times" said that in an interview on Saturday night Dr. Lattimer said the X-rays and photographs completely disposed of any doubt about the validity of the Warren Commission's conclusion that Oswald fired all the shots that hit the President in Dallas in 1963. The commission, appointed by President Johnson a week after the assassi-nation on November 22, 1963, found that Oswald killed the President and that no one assisted him in carrying out the murder.

Commission critics

Critics of the Commission's report have asserted that the photographs and X-rays could disprove its conclusion that the President was struck by only two bullets, both fired from above and behind.

Dr. Lattimer, a New York physician who has written and lectured extensively about the assassination, said the X-rays and photographs the President. 




H.U. expands China, Japan department

The Hebrew University's Department of Chinese and Japanese Studies has recently been expanded and this year will award its first set of bachelor degrees. There are approximately 40 students majoring in Chinese and Japanese studies as compared to 20 two years ago.

Taking full advantage of the Hebrew University's facilities in being able to train scholars in both Chinese and Islamic studies, the Department has a special research interest in the relationship between China and the Middle East both historically and in contemporary terms, Dr. Zvi Schiffrin, Chairman of the Department, points out, "In the field of China and the Middle East we would like to become the major centre; we do not want to be dependent on other institutions for our information on the subject, but want to be the major source; in this particular field we seek preence."
