His victory was expected, for Mr. McCarthy, making his first foray in the primary contests, was not a major rival.

Senator Muskie's winning margin was impressive - but it would count as a landslide only against such figures as Alabama Governor, George Wallace, the Florida victor, Senator Hubert Humphrey, who has moved into the front runner's spot, and other top contenders now campaigning hard in Wisconsin.



WASHINGTON (UPI). - President Nixon said Tuesday he had received assurances from Prime Minister Nihat Erim that Turkey will honour its promise to prohibit cultivation of oplum poppies, which provide the raw material for much of the heroin smuggled into the

Nixon met for an hour and 40 minutes with Erim in the midst of an administration campaign to dramatize the narcotics control prog-ramme, which the President calls his No. 1 domestic priority. Mr. Erim told Nixon, "the present Turkish government is totally committed to stopping all growing of the opium poppy and also to stopping smuggling of narcotics through Turkey that would contribute to the problem in the U.S."

The U.S. has agreed to \$35m. to compensate Turkish farcash crop. Turkey agreed to ban the poppy beginning with this fall's crop, but Mr. Erim faces some discontent at home over the decision

## S.S. captain 'only dealt with details'

VIENNA (AP). — Some 400,880. Hungarian Jews were gathered in 1944 and taken to extermination camps in freight cars, it was stated yesterday in the third day of the trial of wartime S.S. Captain Franz Novak, 59, who was Elchmann's transportation officer.

Mr. Novak, who has been on trial three times before, maintained his defence that he shared no responsibility for this, as he purportedly only drafted details of the train timetables. The verdicts in the previous trials, including one acquittal, had been thrown out by the Austrian Supreme Court.

Testimony by war-time Hungarian police officials, which is part of the indictment, said that Mr. Novak also took part in the gathering of Jews even before the transports to Auschwitz. Mr. Novak replied his only explanation for this testimony was that the Hungarian ex-officials "wanted to shove off everything on the Germans."





The appellant, 18-year-old Mordechal Horowitz, was left in charge of his father's snooker club in Tel Aviv. One evening a quarrel broke out between him and one of the club's patrons, known as Sabi. In the midst of the quarrel, Horowitz ran out into the courtyard of the club, where he had a revolver concealed in case of necessity to protect the club. He took the revolver out of its hiding place, intending to frighten Sabi with it, but changed his mind and went to meet a friend instead, concealing the revolver in his shirt. On his way back, and before he had had a chance to replace the revolver, he met Sabi fortuitously. The latter started taunting him, whereupon he challenged him to a fight, despite the fact that he knew that Sabi was older and stronger than he. Sabi chose a neighbouring courtyard as a suitable place for the fight and when he suddenly picked up a brok-en bottle and threatened Horowitz with it, the latter drew his revolver. In the ensuing scuffle he fired the revolver and fatally injured

In the Tel Aviv District Court Horowitz' counsel argued that his client had fired the gun inadvertently or, alternatively, that he had fired it in self-defence. The District Court held that Horowitz had intended firing the weapon but had not intended killing Sabi, found him guilty of manslaughter under section 212 of the Criminal Code Ordinance, and sentenced him to five years' imprisonment, Horowitz appealed against the conviction and sentence, and the State apmore than is reasonably necessary to defend himself against danger pealed against the manslaughter conviction maintaining that Horowitz should have been found guilty of premeditated murder.

A possibly significant new development occurred when a letter from the District Planning Commission to City Engineer Amikam Yaffe was brought to the attention of the subcommittee members yesterday. The letter reportedly urged that the local planning commission reconsider the question of whether a hotel should be built on the site at all. A subcommittee member told The Jerusalem Post last night that it was the District Planning Commission which had initially approved the idea of a hotel there, and that the subcommittee had considered that it had no choice but to eventually approve one. Mr. Lansky's lawyer contends that the reason for his client's reticence before the Committee was his fear of entanglements with the income tax authorities. But Mr. Bach argued that this was not reason enough for Mr. Lansky not to take this opportunity to clear his name and refute the allegations that he was a top gangster. The Interior Minister, he continued, was fully justified in attaching significance to Mr. Lansky's silence.

SUPERLATIVES At intervals throughout the session, Mr. Bach launched into strings of superlatives to describe the enormity of Mr. Lansky's crimes and the vastness of his power and influence. "We are fortunate in that we cannot even imagine such massive crime," Mr. Bach assured the bench. Often Justice Agranat would restrain the State Attorney from expanding on the "enormity," assuring him in turn that the justices would read all about it in the writ-
