Courts and paternity

The High Court of Justice made absolute an order nisi calling upon the Tel Aviv Rabbinical Court and the second respondent to show cause why the proceedings in two cases before the former should not be stopped for lack of jurisdiction.

The petitioner and the second respondent had lived together as man and wife for more than 8 months. After the petitioner left the second respondent she brought an action against him in the Tel Aviv Rabbinical Court...

In the proceedings before the Rabbinical Court the petitioner admitted he was the father of the unborn child, and this admission was recorded in the court's order postponing proceedings to a later date and restraining the petitioner from leaving the country.

After the child had been born, the respondent brought a further action, for maintenance, in the Rabbinical Court. The petitioner challenged the jurisdiction of that Court without any success...

The petitioner thereupon petitioned the High Court of Justice, arguing that the Rabbinical Court had not had jurisdiction in either of the actions brought by the respondent...

An order nisi was granted the petitioner and on the return day Mr. D. Eitzi appeared for the petitioner and Mr. M. Tabakman for the respondent.

Justice Landau, who delivered the opinion of the Supreme Court, Justices Witkon and Kahn concurring, first considered the question of whether the Rabbinical Court had had jurisdiction in the matter of the petitioner's paternity...
