Governor Mandel in Jerusalem Soviet let Jews go to avoid issue with U.S.

Egypt seeks £100m. in British arms

By DAVID LENNON Jerusalem Post Correspondent LONDON. — Egypt has presented Britain with a shopping list of arms which she wishes to purchase, and it is believed that the government has given provisional approval for most of the items on the list.

Government has been that it will not supply any arms to the region which are likely to upset the military balance.

The Egyptians are reportedly interested in goods worth in the region of £100m., including Scorpion light tanks, Saracen armoured cars, patrol boats, planes and sophisticated electronic equipment.

Schumann: Europeans follow France on M.E.

Jerusalem Post Correspondent PARIS. — French Foreign Minister Maurice Schumann yesterday said that other European countries are coming closer to France's position on the Middle East.

Port might be shared Eban: Gaza won't be separated from Israel

KIRYAT GAT. — Foreign Minister Abba Eban said last night the Gaza Strip would not be separated from Israel although under a peace settlement its port might be shared with Jordan.

Addressing the Economic Club here, Mr. Eban denied there was any deal between Israel and Jordan's King Hussein on the future of the Strip.

The Foreign Minister noted that the Strip had never formed part of the Valley of the Nile and described the Egyptian presence there between 1948 and 1967 as "artificial."

East Germany included Nato invites Soviet bloc to troop talks

BRUSSELS. — The United States and all of its North Atlantic allies except France announced yesterday that they are inviting the Soviet Union, Czechoslovakia, Poland, Hungary and East Germany to talks beginning January 31 on mutual and balanced reduction of military forces.

It was the first time that the Western allies have taken official notice of the East German government, which none of them recognize.

The announcement said the place of the meeting was still to be agreed on, but Foreign Minister Walter Scheel, of West Germany, said Switzerland was suggested.

They now will be present at the talks as observers.

Acceptance by the Soviet Union and its allies should pose no problems, sources said.

It all goes well, the full security conference could start in the early summer of 1973, followed soon afterwards by full troop talks.

The 13 nations having troops in the integrated Nato command "agree to propose that exploratory talks on this matter should be held beginning on the 31st of January 1973, in a place still to be agreed through diplomatic channels," a Nato communique said.

German Foreign Minister Scheel warned yesterday against expecting any quick results from the talks.

"The governments of Belgium, Canada, the Federal Republic of Germany, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom and the United States are communicating this proposal to the governments of Czechoslovakia, Poland, Hungary and the U.S.S.R.," the communique said.

He told reporters that the conference would be a highly complex and technical attempt to cut down troops and weapons.

West Germany is sending an invitation to the East German government, it said. The countries involved are those situated in central Europe or having troops there.

Yesterday's announcement of a further step towards ending the cold war in Europe comes just two days before West Germany's crucial general election on Sunday. It is expected to boost Willy Brandt's chances of re-election. The 58-year-old Nobel Peace Prize winner is campaigning as "the chancellor of peace."

Originally the West wanted the troop talks to start at the same time as the preparations for the security conference. The East Bloc was wary to agree. U.S. Presidential adviser Henry Kissinger swung the November-January deal when he visited Moscow last September.

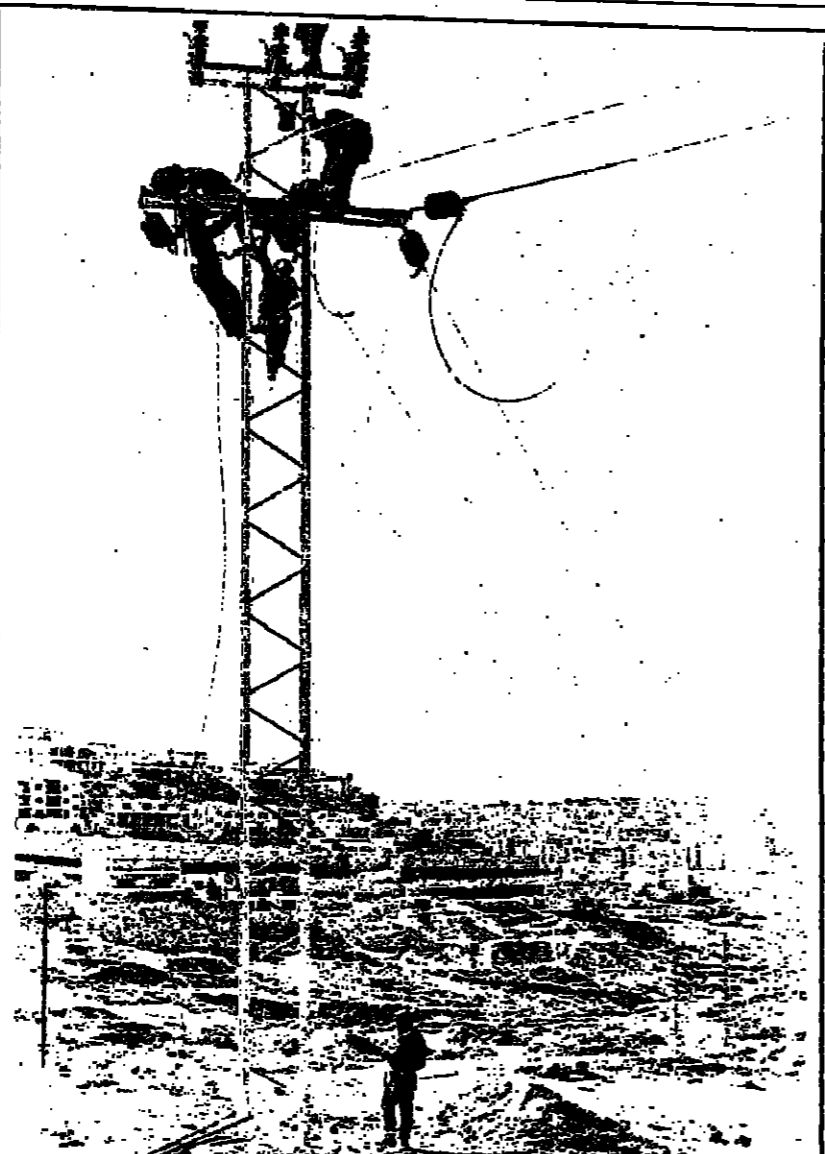

To be based on glasshouse farming AMERICANS SETTING UP MOSHAV IN THE NEGEV

The first agricultural moshav to be settled predominantly by Americans in 20 years will be launched next spring at a virgin site in the Eshkol Region, west of Beerseba.

Attempt to get Chief Rabbis together today

Chief Rabbi Goren's bureau chief, Yitzhak Strassberg, is making efforts to bring about a meeting today between the two Chief Rabbis, estranged over the Langer mamzer case.

Mr. Strassberg told The Jerusalem Post that Rabbi Goren and Yosef always have a meeting in Tel Aviv on Fridays, and he hoped one would take place today as usual.

Rabbi Goren wants Rabbi Yosef to join him and one other dayan in a special court to hear the case. Rabbi Yosef wants the full complement of the Supreme Rabbinical Court — with the two Chief Rabbis — to rehear the case.

The file containing previous documents on the case from regional rabbinical courts, which ex-Chief Rabbi Yitzhak Nissim handed to the Secretary of the Rabbinical Supreme Court on Wednesday, has been deposited in a bank vault for safekeeping.

The three will be charged with attempted rape, theft and committing an indecent act by force.

West Bank and Gaza Strip State for Palestinians said mooted in Cairo

BEIRUT (Reuters). — The mass-circulation "Al-Nahar" newspaper reported yesterday that Arab circles in Cairo were discussing a plan to set up a Palestinian state comprising the West Bank of the Jordan and the Gaza Strip as a way of solving the Middle East problem.

The independent Lebanese newspaper said in a dispatch from Cairo that the "European-International" project might be touched upon during the current conference in Kuwait of Arab foreign and defence ministers.

It added that the project required talks between Arab League Secretary-General Mahmoud Riad and United Nations Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim. Dr. Waldheim would convey the Arab viewpoint to Israel, expected to be represented by Foreign Minister Abba Eban,

Bonn to pay \$31m. to Polish Nazi camp victims

GENEVA (UPI). — West Germany yesterday agreed to pay compensation of 100 million marks to Polish victims of pseudo-medical experiments in Nazi concentration camps.

An agreement between the Bonn and Polish governments was signed at the headquarters of the International Red Cross, which since 1961 has been reviewing individual cases.

On the basis of the Red Cross investigations, West Germany has already paid a total of 40 million marks (\$12,392,000) to 1,357 persons examined by Red Cross doctors.

Poland said there were some 6,000 other people suffering from the Nazi experiments. Rather than have each case examined separately, Germany agreed on a global compensation. Polish authorities are responsible for making payments according to the severity of the injuries.

\$7m. hashish haul in Alexandria

CAIRO (AP). — Egyptian police found 3.5 tons of hashish worth \$6.9m. inside automobile tyres near Agami beach, three miles west of Alexandria Port. "Akhar" newspaper reported yesterday.

Hanoi rejects basic changes in agreement

PARIS (UPI). — North Vietnam yesterday rejected any basic changes in the draft cease-fire agreement for Vietnam. The United States said peace was coming nevertheless.

Hanoi negotiator Xuan Thuy told the 16th session of peace talks. "We resolutely reject all pretexts put forward by the U.S. and Saigon for modification of the substance of the agreement."

He told newsmen: "There is no argument which militates in favour of a modification of the agreement. We demand that the U.S. sign the draft as it has been agreed as early as possible."

The U.S. has postponed signing the agreement pending a final round of negotiations.

The senior American negotiator, William Porter, said: "Each of us is aware that the restoration of peace in Vietnam is approaching. The goal of a peaceful settlement (is) much nearer than we imagined only a few weeks ago."

He called on the Communists not to endanger peace by invective, exaggerated rhetoric, recriminations and unfounded charges of bad faith.

Meanwhile, in Moscow, North Vietnam's chief peace negotiator, Le Duc Tho, conferred yesterday with a trio of high-ranking Soviets

Master forger's paintings sell for up to \$2,000

NEW YORK (UPI). — A group of 31 paintings by master art-forgery David Stein went on display Wednesday at a Manhattan gallery at prices ranging up to \$2,000 for a work in the style of Chagall.

The show at the Adam Gallery also included acrylic paintings in the styles of Picasso, Van Gogh, Braque, Matisse, and Modigliani, but all were clearly signed by Stein. There even were some "Stein Steins" in the artist's own style, which is considered less interesting than his versions of the modern masters.

At a preview opening Tuesday night, three paintings were sold for \$125, \$350 and \$600.

It was Chagall who tipped authorities in 1967 to Stein's activities, which were reported to have grossed him nearly \$2m. The artist looked over the "Chagalls" in Stein's Park Avenue gallery and went to the District Attorney. The case received wide publicity and caused embarrassment to a number of museums and private collectors.

Stein was jailed in New York for 10 months, then extradited to France for trial on charges stemming from forgery activities there.

U.N. Assembly asks member to deny aid to South Africa

UNITED NATIONS (AP). — The U.N. General Assembly asked members of the European Economic Community on Wednesday to deny aid and "commercial or other facilities" to South Africa so long as it practices apartheid, or race segregation.

The request, in a resolution recommended by the special political committee, was also addressed to members of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, the International Monetary Fund and other "international agencies and organizations."

The resolution passed by a vote of 100-4 with 21 abstentions. The U.S., Britain and Portugal joined South Africa in voting against it.

Those abstaining were Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Sweden, Malawi, Israel, Japan, Guatemala and Uruguay.

The resolution called upon "all governments" to carry out the Security Council's non-binding 1963 arms embargo against South Africa and asked the Council to consider the South African situation urgently with a view to adopting "economic and other sanctions" under the U.N. Charter's enforcement provisions.

It condemned "the continuing increasing cooperation of certain states and foreign economic interests with South Africa" and asked all countries "to uphold the Olym principle of non-discrimination sports and withhold any support from sporting events organized in violation of this principle." It also condemned South Africa "for continuing and intensifying apartheid and condemned the establishment of so-called Bantustans in South Africa and the exportation of apartheid to neighbouring African territories, especially South Africa."

TEKOA CHARGES AT U.N.

Arabs 'waging Hitlerite campaign' to exterminate Jews by terrorism

UNITED NATIONS (AP). — Israel accused Arab governments yesterday of waging a Hitlerite campaign to exterminate the Jews by terrorism.

"In Israel, every Jew, whether man, woman or child, is considered a target for murder," ambassador Yosef Tekoah told the General Assembly's legal committee, which is considering measures to combat terrorists.

Like the U.S., Israel pressed for a conference to draw up a convention providing for the prosecution of extradition of terrorists. Arab and African countries, viewing the call as a campaign directed against Palestinian and African liberation movements, have demanded a study of the root causes of terrorism.

Tekoah claimed these delegations "by pressing for delay and inaction... are doing their utmost to bring this discussion to naught despite the world-wide desire to put an end to atrocities such as the Lod massacre and the Munich killings."

BRITISH legal expert J.R. Freeland told the U.N.'s legal committee that London is holding secret talks with other governments on tightening supervision of international travel and documents and on improving contacts between police systems in different countries.

The U.S. has asked the General Assembly to convene a world meeting next year to approve its draft treaty requiring extradition or punishment of terrorists acting outside their own countries or committing acts harmful to other countries and their citizens.

Freeland said Britain supports the U.S. proposal but "this approach may not reach wide enough — in the light of what is in fact happening in more than one part of the world."

He said the U.S. draft treaty probably should be broadened to discourage countries from assisting or instigating terrorists. Britain has been plagued by terrorist violence in Northern Ireland.

Commenting on the delaying action of some Arab and African delegates, Freeland said, "It would not be right for the innocent victims, or potential victims, of the terrorists to be left to wait for protection until the underlying causes have been fully remedied... even causes opposed by terrorists which merit our sympathy... must not be promoted by terrorist activities."

Senegal and Cameroon said they could not support the U.S. proposal because it might help perpetuate colonialism in Africa.

Poland said international terrorism should be condemned and such acts were not really connected with the right of self-determination. Rather than supporting urgent action toward a treaty, however, Polish delegate Alfons Klafkowski said the question should be turned over to the international law commission.

Czechoslovakia said that while they favoured mass revolutionary violence the Communists had always rejected as harmful "the tactic of individual terror."

Nearly every country in the General Assembly has spoken or plans to speak in the terrorism debate, expected to run through next week. African and Arab delegates are meeting daily in an attempt to frame a joint alternative to the U.S. proposal.

The Soviet Union was listed to speak today. China has not yet put its name on the speakers' list.

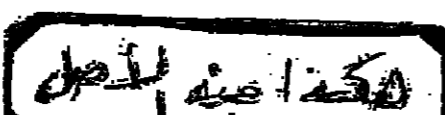

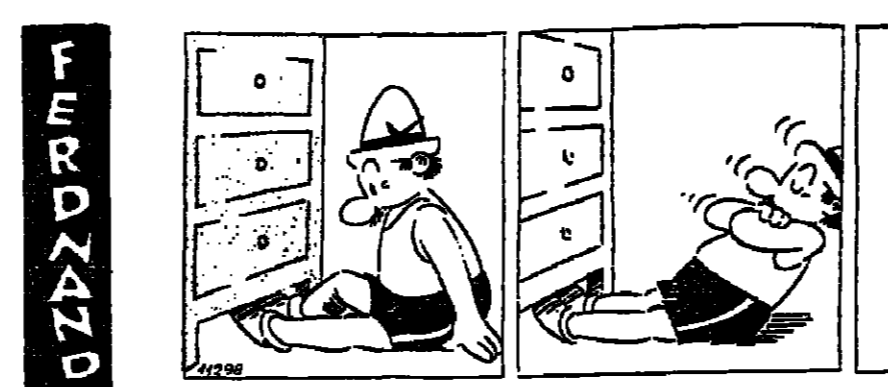
