BRUSSELS. — The United States and all of its North Atlantic allies except France announced yesterday that they are inviting the Soviet Union. Czechoslovakia, Poland, Hungary and East Germany to talks beginning January 31 on mutual and balanced reduction of military forces.

It was the first time that the Western allies have taken official





Commenting on the delaying action of some Arab and African delegates, Freeland said, "It would not be right for the innocent victims, or potential victims, of the terrorists to be left to wait for protection until the underlying causes have been fully remedied . . even causes espoused by terrorists which merit our sympathy must not be pro-moted by terrorist activities." Senegal and Cameroon said they

could not support the U.S. proposal because it might help perpetuate colonialism in Africa.

Poland said international terror-ism should be condemned and such acts were not really connected with the right of self-determination. Rather than supporting urgent action to-ward a treaty, however, Polish dele-gate Alfons Klafkowski said the question should be turned over to the international law commission.

Czechoslovakia said that while they favoured mass revolutionary violence the Communists had always rejected as harmful "the tactic of Individual terror."

Nearly every country in the Gen-eral Assembly has spoken or plans to speak in the terrorism debate, expected to run through next week.



LONDON (UPI). — West European governments, discouraged by failure to align their policy, have abandoned plans for a European Middle East peace initiative, diplomatic sources

said yesterday. They will instead take a backseat on Middle East peace strategy for the forseeable future, leaving it to the United States to make the

next move or moves.
In the absence of an agreed European posture, individual Western countries, notably Britain, have no immediate plans to proceed on their own, or in direct cooperation with the U.S., unless invited to assist.

Rut diplomatic quarters were sceptical of any early major development on the Middle East peace front, with both the U.S. and the Soviet Union believed to be marking time in the light of considerable uncertainties surrounding the entire Middle East situation.

certainty over the course of the Cairo regime which has been veering sharply in recent months, since the ouster of the Soviet advisers last summer, the diplomatic sources

Russia, according to the informants, wants to gain time also to clarify and consolidate her shaken position in Egypt in order to strengthen her hand in any political settlement.

POLITICAL SETTLEMENT

The Soviet line was to remain firmly in favour of a political settlement soon and opposed to a military solution, chiefly because Moscow does not want to get involved, directly or indirectly, especially with an eye to her plans to consolidate the friendly relationship

Soviet advisers and arms, though limited in scope and number, were expected to be sent

to Egypt again. New shipments reportedly have reached Egypt lately. But diplomatic informants reported continued Soviet unwillingness to send the type of offensive weapons which could unleash

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat has voiced his scepticism by telling his people this week he did not expect any more action to help engineering a settlement from either Russia

or America. Meanwhile individual efforts are going ahead such as Libya's latest apparently successful attempt to get more arms from France, in-

Egypt has not yet sent her shopping list for arms to Britain but is known to be in the buyers' market. Britain has signified her readiness to sell defensive weapons, including Rapier low-level anti-aircraft missiles, but no Chieftain





Defending the purchase of the two planes, he said: "There are so many hijackings of commercial planes. This is why he needs his own planes. 

RED-TAPE HOLDS UP BUILDING

SOME of the building difficulties for flats not yet built facing Israel during the next decade were the subject of a recent

Avraham Ofer, M.K., managing director of the Histadrut housing company, "Shikun Ovdim," estima-ted that 50,000 housing units a year are now being built in Israel. He did not think this number needed to be increased, as only about 33,000 flats — two-thirds of the total were required to cope with the growth in the number of families as a result of both immigration and marriage. The remainder served to improve living conditions, and Mr. Ofer thought 17,000 units was suf-

gramme of half a million flousing units over the next decade as "stupendous," considering that there were at present no more than 780,000 in the entire country.

Mr. Ofer criticized the long delays in implementing building plans. Red tape caused an enormous waste of energy and loss of time. Even in a city like Beersheba, which certainly did not lack building sites, it took an unnecessary time to receive approval for a relatively simple building project from all the authorities concerned. Jerusalem Post Reporter The Government is prepared to help industry fight pollution by giving firms tax reductions on anti-pollution equipment. But all new applicants for government aid in setting up industries will have to prove that they have potential pol-

After Vietnam: China v. Russia

to be drawing to an uneasy close, tension between China and the Soviet Union is increasing again. The Soviet Union owes much of its influence in the East Asian region to its strong material and moral support of North Vietnam while remaining apparently eager for peace in Indo-china. It is, therefore, anxious that its influence should not recede once the guns are stilled.

China, which throughout the war has reluctantly accepted the Soviet Union's role in assisting the Hanoi Government to an extent beyond Peking's resour-ces, is keen to break the Soviet encirclement of its borders and oust Moscow from a dominant role in Southeast Asia - and also in the South Asian Indian

With peace but a stroke of a pen away in Vietnam, China is manoeuvring to ensure that a waning of American influence in the region will be matched by a similar Russian eclipse.

The first salvo in the renewed Sino-Soviet jousting came on October 1, when, in its tradi-tional editorial marking the anniversary of the founding of the Chinese People's Republic, the official Peking People's shocked Communist diplomats by calling Soviet social imperialism more dangerous than old-style imperialism. This was the first time such a sentiment had been expressed — and Chinese leaders have repeated it since to ram the point home.

This latest move in relations between the two countries fol-lows more than three years of abortive talks in Peking after the series of six battles along the Ussuri River in 1969 when

AS the Indochina war appears Chinese and Soviet troops clashed on their common border.

The cudgels were taken up again when Chinese Vice-Foreign Minister Chiao Kuan-Hua, addressing the United Nations General Assembly in New York, fiercely criticized Moscow on a whole gamut of issues. This week, once more, and again at the U.N., he accused the Soviet Union of working with the U.S. to try to keep the world under their control.

At the same there have been indications that the Soviet Union has also decided to take a harder line. They are known to be disconcerted by China's growing success with the nations of the so-called Third World, which follows its decision not to promote armed revolution abroad but to assert itself as the spokesman for developing countries.

But China appeared to be implying there was some sort of tangible threat when Western correspondents in Peking, but not Soviet and East Bloc journalists, were invited to see Pe-king's huge underground nuclear shelter system.

And in an interview with Scandinavian journalists, Premier Chou En-lai for the first time expressed doubts over the So-viet Union's sincerity in wishing to see the Vietnam war end.

Although the diminishing American presence in Asia leaves the prospect of the return of Taiwan to China more real, as seen in Peking it also leaves the Soviet Union as a potential domi-nant military force in the motion nant military force in the region. It is this the Chinese are trying to forestall in their latest verbal attacks on the Soviet Union and its aims. As the Vietnam war winds down, conflict between these two giants begins to loom large.

Divided within, Arabs seek unity on Israel

ONE of the main developments which seem to be emerging from the current conference of the Arab Foreign and Defence Ministers in Kuwait appears to be Egypt's success in persuading the Arab states to back Cairo's acceptance of Security Council resolution 242, at a time when the U.N. is preparing to debate the Middle East crisis later this month.

It was surprising to hear that the delegates of those Arab states which opposed the resolution, adopted in November, 1967, had told Kuwalt TV that they were agreed that the issue was the recovery of the Arab territories lost in 1967. The same states had been stressing that the issue was that of recovering "all Palestine."

The statement to the TV interviewer in no way meant a change in the basic attitude of these governments, for their spokesmen also stressed the necessity of restoring "the rights of the Arab people of Palestine."

Judging from the new-old terminology being used this week, Egypt is believed to have convinced its critics that basically there was no difference between its call for the recovery of lost territories and the restoration of the Palestinian Arabe' rights to their former homeland, on the one hand, and the call of others who have been insisting on the recovery

of Arab rights "in all Palestine," on the other. Furthermore, by rallying all the Arab states behind the Security Council resolution, Egypt appears to be seeking to leave the door open for a political settlement, overall or partial, while buying time for building up Arab military strength. The Arabs realize that their strength is still no match for Israel's.

But while Egypt evidently is steering the Kuwait gathering towards such ends, the con-ference still faces the dominant problem of getting the Palestinian terrorist movement to adjust itself to pan-Arab strategies.

The Egyptians stick to the paradoxical opinion that, while the Arab states stage their political manoeuvres and prepare for a conventional hattle, the terrorists should carry out sabotage activities to keep the Middle East crisis "alive." This Egyptian stand has, in the past few months, created a kind of vicious circle, with the terrorists carrying out sabotage activity and Israel striking at their bases in the Arab host countries.

The Egyptians also express the belief that no common Arab action can be efficient unless Jordan joins a unified strategy calling for renewed terrorist activity from Jordanian ter-

ritory.

Jordan appears to hold that the continued existence of the terrorist movement in its present inefficient framework would only jeopardize both the political manoeuvres and the military preparations of the Arab states. This at a time that Amman seems to have begun to believe that the Israel-Arab conflict can be settled through peaceful means, as King Hus-

THE irony of the Kuwait conference lies in the fact that the Arab states gathered to unify their ranks at a time when the ranks inside some of these states have never before been in such disarray.

In Egypt, President Anwar Sadat this week launched a series of top-level political meetings, the first round of which reflected the concern of Egyptians over the internal troubles which have been plaguing the country for some time.

Cairo's government-controlled press indi-cated that his meetings concentrated on four major issues: the religious strife among the country's six million Copts, following Mosiem-Coptic clashes in Cairo and the northern city of Khanka; the shakeups within the political and military leadership; the unclear arma-

ment situation in view of the currently cool Cairo-Moscow relations; and the university students' unrest over the deteriorating political and military situation.

MIBDLE EAST

So far Sadat has been handling the internai turmoil in a rather dictatorial manner, relying on police rule, which is resented by student circles and some sections of the

Another participant in the conference struggling for a role in the pan-Arab arena is frag, which seemed this week to be on the brink of a new civil war over the Kurds' fight for autonomy in the north.

The Soviet Union, which has been strengthening its foothold in Iraq since Moscow's rift with Cairo, has been making efforts to avert the threat of a war between Baghdad and the Kurds through intensive contacts with the Kurdish leader, Mulla Mustafa Barazani.

But Barazani is rapidly passing into a legend among the Kurds, who are now looking to-wards the younger leadership headed by Ha-bib Mohammed Karim, the Secretary-General of the powerful Kurdish Democratic Party. for action. This party accuses the Iraqi Ba'ath authorities of violating the March, 1970, pact pledging full autonomy to the Kurds.

The situation at the moment seems to de-

pend on a signal from the Kurdish leader, Dr. Mohammed Othman, who is heading nego-tiations with the Iraqi authorities over his community's demands.

THERD country that has been advocating A TETRD country that has been advocating common Arab action is Lebanon, which was this week plagued with internal disturbances sparked off by isbour demonstrations.

The labour unrest in the Lebanon followed the death of two workers and the injury of 17 others in a clash with the security authorities. But, overnight, the demonstrations and strikes came to reflect the unstable political situation and the struggle between the Lebanese right and left.

The week's events in Lebanon were swiftly concluded with the army takeover of internal security. This is the third time within a few months that the army has taken control in the country which until recently was considered as the only functioning democracy in the Arab world. Lebanon's political life has for some time

now been sectarian and corrupt. But the latest developments resulted largely from Beirut's recently increased involvement in the general Arab policy line which the Kuwait conference is currently tackling.

Lebanon's latest involvement in the Middle East crisis and its subsequent linkage with terrorist activity has clearly led to internal repercussions which have affected the country's political and economic life.

It is doubtful whether Lebanon can find through the current Kuwait conference a way out of its current ordeal.
