Two letter bombs to British Jews

LONDON. — Two letter bombs turned up in England over the weekend, one addressed to a Jew-ish Member of Parliament and one to the premises of a Jewish firm.
The name of the Jewish M.P., who is a Labourite, was kept secret at the request of Scotland Yard. The letter was spotted and rendered harmless on Friday by the security services.

The other letter, discovered yesterday, was addressed to the Belfast Veneering Company — which does not exist. It was sent to a Liverpool building which is occupied by a Jewish firm, Silverston Veneering Company.

Police issued a warning to the city's Jewish community to report even the slightest suspicion about letters they receive. (INA, UPI)

LOD AIRPORT. — Defence Min-ister Moshe Dayan said here on Friday that he expected the Mid-dle East situation to be raised during top-level contacts next

Mr. Dayan was speaking to reporters on his return from a short visit to the U.S., where he met with Secretary of State William Rogers and Pentagon officials, and spoke at fund-raising railies for the U.J.A. and Israel Bonds.

Replying to questions, the Minister said there may well be top-level contacts between Soviet and American leaders in 1973, and the Middle East conflict would certainly come up in the discussions. He said he expected President Nixon's new administration to turn to the Middle East problem only after the Vietnam war was ended and after it had completed its own internal

There were no fundamental dif-ferences, Mr. Dayan stressed, between the Israell and the American attitude to the conflict. Both wanted negotiations and both were striving

for peace.

As to the cease-fire, Mr. Dayan said he believed it would continue, despits occasional shooting. But "we should not be worried about a renewal of the war." The Arab states, he said, were not in a post-

The new airlift was being made to face what was described as a possible Israel pre-emptive strike against Syria. It was stated that the decision





T.A. Mayor calls for confederation of cities

TEL AVIV. - Tens of millions of pounds could be saved annually by Dan Region municipalities if there was some form of a confederation between the area's cities, Tel Aviv Mayor Yehoshus Rabinowitz told members of the Knesset Interior Committee last Thursday, The Mayor, a strong advocate of municipal consolidation, was speaking about Tel Aviv's main problems with the committee members, headed by Mr. Mordechai Surkiss M.K., who were Tel Aviv's guests on Thursday.

Mr. Rabinowitz contended that the chief cause for all that alls Tel Aviv is the fact that nearly a million residents of the metropolitan area use this city's services daily. But since more than half of them live in neighbouring towns, they enjoy what Tel Aviv has to offer without paying any municipal taxes. Tel Aviv spends as much as IL25m. a year on services for out-of-towners,

SADAT IN TROUBLE

IN the Arab countries, and in Egypt in particular, it takes a strong leader to make peace. A weak one is more likely to seek refuge in making war, or at least threatening war, as a proposal that people do not like to oppose publicly. When Egypt's President Sadat succeeded Nasser upon his death a little over two years ago he was not given a long political life, and it may well be that these prophecies will belatedly come true in the future. He bought some popularity, and perhaps time, by throwing out the Russian advisers so unceremoniously last July, but the frequent trips of Egyptian leaders to Moscow since to restart a necessary minimum of Soviet technical aid and supplies has tarnished the image of Sadat the Soviet-killer. If he had believed that either the Chinese or anyone in Europe could service and supply his Soviet weapons, he was fated to be disillusioned. A professional conspirator, he has now taken to the last resort of police-state control of his opponents, and it is not likely to endear him to anyone.

The result is that President Sadat has again been threatening war, and instructing the controlled press to do the same. This will not restore his prestige, for a war is very unlikely at this time, and the Cairo students in particular have become incensed in the past at the indignity of vainglorious threats that are never translated into action. It is unfortunate that Sadat's in-ternal troubles should have built up to such a degree at the present time, which might be more favourable than ever before for some move towards a settlement. With the Vietnam war coming rapidly to its close the Suez Canal has lost its primary im-portance for the Soviet Union as a means to transport war supplies to the Far East, and hesitations previously felt in the U.S. on reopening the Canal now no longer apply. Defence Minister Dayan has returned from his visit to Washington persuaded that the Americans would like to see some move made to break the deadlock and pointed out that the proposal had come from Israel, and the problem was to get Egypt's agreement. Even the inter-Arab meeting in Kuwait that has just broken up did not reject all forms of settlement as violently as is customary on such occa-sions, though they did reject a partial agreement on Sinai, the only thing possible at the mo-

The Americans often seem in a greater hurry in the Middle East than they were in their own involvements in Korea and Viet-nam. The crucial negotiations over an agreement with Egypt on the Canal cannot be hurried though if carried out in the right way they might be of the greatest benefit for all sides, and greatest benefit for all sides, and reduce the need for the enormous build-up of military personnel and equipment on the border with Egypt. But before anything of that kind will be even remotely possible conditions in Egypt will have to be stabilized politically again, and it is beginning to look as though that might not happen under its present ruler.

'Die Zeit' raps 'fanatics' in Israel and Germany

BONN — West Germany's leading political weekly, "Die Zeit." has strongly criticized "fanatics" in both Israel and Germany who disturb relations between the two countries.

An outspoken editorial in the

latest issue, under the heading "After the Storm," takes sup-porters of the Christian Democratic opposition party to task for an election advertisement which suggested the Brandt government was doing nothing for "our Jewish fellow citizens."

The bulk of "Die Zeit's" remarks are, however, directed towards Israel. "A special relationship," it states, "clearly cannot mean that we must put up with everything from the Israeli side, including unjus-tified, indefensible criticism." Examples of the latter were the charge that West Germany had capitulated to Arab terrorism during the Lufthansa hijacking or the "monstrous" claim of conspiracy between German and Arab security services in the affair (in which Germany released the three Arab terrorists involved in the Munich massacre of Israeli athletes).

EGYPTIAN COPTS ON EDGE AFTER NEW CHURCH FIRE

The outlawed Moslem Brotherhood, which is thought to be involved in recent attacks on Christians in Egypt, feels a strong affinity to Libyan leader Mu'ammar Gaddafi, writes the AP's ALEX EFTY.

BEIRUT (AP). - The burning of a Coptic church in Cairo last week is a rekindling of a campaign by the banned extreme right-wing Moslem Brotherhood, observers here

The objectives of the fanatic Brotherhood are both to curb Ohristian influence and to undermine the authority of President Anwar Sadat and the Arab Socialist Union—Egypt's only political party — the observers add.

The previous spate of church burning last summer prompted a strong protest memorandum from the Coptic Church leader-ship to President Sadat. The memorandum, dated July 18, demanded firm action

to end alleged government-tol-erated discrimination against the 6.5 million Coptic com-munity and attacks on their faith by official Moslem bodies. The memorandum also charged that teachers at the Cairo Moslem university of Al-Azhar bracket Zionism with Chris-

In a series of speeches last summer, Sadat acknowledged the existence of sectarian strife. He blamed U.S. imperialism, however, claiming that anti-Christian and anti-Mos-lem tracts emanating from the U.S. had been mailed to members of the respective communities in Egypt, to sow discord and weaken national unity.

Never published

The Coptic protest memorandum, which warned that the Copts would "choose martyrdom rather than lead a humiliating existence in our own country," was never published country," was never published in the Egyptian press, It was,

however, followed by a meeting of the Coptic Pope Shenuda III with Moslem religious leaders and separate appeals stressing the imperative need for national unity.

President Sadat also rushed through Parliament a tough new law making any activity or statement endangering national unity an offence punishable with life imprisonment. The Copts toned down their protest after this, feeling that the new law was a double-edged weapon which could be applied to them as well as their detractors.

The new outbreak of attacks on the Coptic community and its churches developed

simultaneously with a fresh anti-Soviet campaign, especially on the campus of Cairo University. This in turn followed the resumption of a dialogue between Cairo and Moscow, to bridge the rift created by the expulsion of the Soviet military advisers from Egypt last July.

Probe ordered

In an effort to safeguard national unity, President Sadat appointed a special Parliamentary commission to investigate the latest church burning. At the same time, editorials in Cairo's newspapers denounced the church burning as an attempt to weaken national unity by the enemies of the

Some observers believe that the increase of anti-Soviet and anti-Coptic activity may partly attributable to the fluence of Libyan leader Mu'ammer Gaddan, a staunch anti-Communist and a fanatical believer in Mosiem righteousness.

Some Arab newspapers, inciuding pro-Nasser ones in Beirut, spoke openly of Mos-lem Brotherhood influence on Gaddafi following his recent decision to introduce the Islamic law punishment of amputation for convicted thieves. Observers feel that Egypt's latent right-wing opposition, including the Moslam Brothers, regard Gaddefing and Caddefing gard Gaddafi as a good man to rally around, especially in view of the projected union of Libya with Egypt by next September.


