





TEL AVIV. - Histadrut women's lib advocate Aliza Tamir halled yesterday's Labour Court decision against sex discrimination in El Al as a turning point in the fight for equal rights for working women.

Mrs. Tamir, secretary of the Histadrut's Salaried Women Workers' Division, was speaking at a press conference celebrating the quashing of work-contract clauses which put the stewardesses at a disadvantage with respect to stewards. 





Dangers in illuminated signs, study reveals

Jerusalem Post Reporter

HAIFA KEEP away from illuminated fluorescent publicity signs popularly known as neon signs - or from the steel pylons to which many of them are attached. They are apt to be faulty, without earthing, and if something goes wrong, anyone touching the pylon or any other metal part linked with the sign runs the risk of electrocution.

'An investigation by Development Ministry engineer Victor Suess in the Halfa area has revealed that many of the signs have been defective from the start, installed by electrical firms which disregard the safety regulations — a fact of which the people who buy the signs are generally ignorant. The Ministry and the police are now trying to decide which is to prosecute the offenders.

The investigation began after the Paul Lamberg publicity agency, which ordered many of the signs from contractors, complained to the police, the Ministry and the Electric Corporation. In order to make their prices competitive, the contractors in question had installed signs without condensers (which adjust inequalities of voltage in the electricity supply), often without earthing.

The Electric Corporation spokesman explained that it did not supervise or check the installation of publicity signs. If a con-tractor submitted a plan, the company's experts checked and approved it, but nobody was obfiged to submit a plan.

NO STAFF

The Development Ministry spokesman explained that its own office responsible for supervising electrical installations and equipment did not have the staff to check electric signs throughout the country. It arranged for the training and licensing of electriclans, who were expected to comply with all the safety regulations. If they violated them, they could be prosecuted and have their licence withdrawn. spokesman admitted that the Development Ministry could not prevent unitcensed persons from installing signs and that is lacked means of enforcing the safety regulations against them.

It appears that unscrupulous contractors have, perhaps for years, been taking advantage of this loophole, The Ministry is entitled to issue administrative orders forbidding the use of dan-gerous electric installations or equipment; but is apparently at loss as to how it can take action to protect the public in the case of faulty publicity

Experts say that to make the faulty signs throughout the country conform to statutory safety standards would cost a vast amount. While the offending firms now face prosecution for criminal negligence, the question remains: which public agency is going to enforce the safety re-



AVIV. - The computer can provide valuable diagnostic aid to the physician - but it is the doctor himself who must make the vital decisions. This was stated yesterday by Dr. Gary Rosenberg, of Rothschild Hospital in Haifa, who with the help of the Technion staff, has drawn up a "differential diagnostic programme" to help diagnose patients admitted to the hospital in come. He was speaking at the eighth data processing conference being held at the Hilton Hotel.

Dr. Rosenberg, a physician, said the computer was limited by the information the doctor fed it. Doctors would stress different symptoms and findings depending on their educa-

Another factor was that different doctors, due to different systems of education, used different terminology. Moreover, the computer lacked "common sense" and "Intuition" and the best diagnosis consisted of a combination of factual findings backed up with a highly developed intuitive

Nevertheless, with all its draw-backs, the computer could provide the physician with a wealth of factual information, thus allowing him to speed up his own diagnosis. For example, as soon as the patient in a coma was admitted (a comatose patient was selected since the patient himself could provide little information, thus forcing the doctor to relate mainly to outward physical symptoms), the physical findings were fed into the computer. It would reply that it seemed that the cause be performed. On the basis of the results of these tests, the computer would make certain other sugges-tions as to the ailment, and suggest further tests.

Dr. Fred Wiener, of the Technion, who used a computer to tabulate the most frequent blood type in Israel, according to a survey of 50,000 donors, was "A" with 34.9 per cent; followed by "O" with 31.5 per cent; B" with 16.8 per cent and "AB" with 7.3 per cent. All these are Rh plus and thus 90.5 per cent of Israelis have Rh plus blood. The remainder consists of Rh minus types, with "AB" Rh minus being the rarest in Israel, with only 0.6 per cent of the people having it.

German priest says Israel should 'show restraint'

Moscow artist's works to be shown here

Jerusalem Post Réporter AVIV. - Deputy Prime Minister Yigal Allon on Sunday will open an exhibition of oils and drawings by the Moscow painter Nathan Feingold at the Artists' House in Jerusalem. Feingold, who has not yet been allowed to leave Russia, has sent a message to the opening, stat-ing he discovered his "essential Judaism" when he began painting.
Art, he says, is "basically national"
and could not develop outside its natural cultural environment.

A communications engineer who was on the team that worked on the Soviet satellites programme, Fringold, 43, quit his work in 1966 and waited the statutory five-year period for persons connected with security projects before applying for permission to go to Israel, However, te has so far been refused an exit visa. His wife's papers are in Isrnel.

When Nobel Prize laureate Heinrich Boell was in Moscow several years ago, he called on Feincold and acquired a painting from him. An exhibition of Feingold's work at the Moscow University in 1967 won laudatory notices in the Soviet press. Feingold uses Jewish themes in his works, including Hebrew characters. The exhibition is being arranged under the auspices of the National Council for Soviet Jewry.





SELLING TO THE 'JEWISH MARKET' — FOR AND AGAINST

JF a little bit of Jewish sentiment can help sell Israel's goods abroad, that sentiment should be exploited. That's the view of Mr. Uzi Fainermen, M.K., and ms position will carry considerable weight when the matter

For months now Mr. Fainermen has been heading the Knesset Economic Committee's "Subcommittee on the Jewish Market." In an effort to bolster exports to North America (which have been levelling off recently), the subcommittee has been looking into the so-called "Jewish market" in the U.S. to help sustain the volume of shipments to America.

Mr. Fainermen's sub-committee meets on Monday for its summing-up session. It will probably recommend that the Government the Jewish Agency, selected exporters and interested Jewish communities in the U.S. all join together in an experimental test marketing effort "to find out once and for all wiset is the resi potential of this "lewish Market."

I see nothing wrong with this," Mr. Feinermen told The Jerusalem Poet earlier this week. As matter of fact, I think playing up the Jewish aspect of our products has a value over and above the commercial side of things.

I think it's good Zionism.

don't see why this couldn't happen today But Mr. Fainermen hastens to add: "On the other hand, I restize that Jewish identification with Israel's merchantise cannot and must not cover up for defective goods or bad service, such as false delivery dates. The products must arrive on the market in a competitive position, along with non-Israeli goods. From that point on, let the sentimental

factor enter into the picture."

But some circles at the Ministry of Commerce and Industry scoff at the whole idea. "Any item that leaves this country must be able to stand on its own two feet" is the way a Ministry official put it to The Jerusalem Post recently. Tribuic sentiment is fine, but you cannot build an economic basis on sen-

Even if the concept of a "Jewish market"

were commercially viable, these circles believe, there would be the practical problem of marketting. They point to demographic studies that indicate a continuing dispersion of Jewish families in America. As years pass, more and more families leave the old concentrations of Jews and move to less densely populated areas. Therefore, pinpointing "Jewish markets" would become increasingly difficult.

Another problems is that all Israel food specialties are automatically relegated to the "Kosher Foods" sections, which attract a himited traffic — Jewish housewives who also happen to be interested in purchasing kosher foods. Ministry officials would rather see Israel products competing on the main shelves, along with Portuguese sardines, Formosan pineapple, Canadian salmon, Japanese tuna and Polish ham.

A related headsche for the Ministry and its trade commissioners abroad is a well-intentioned practice common among the Jewish community centres in the U.S., Canada and Britain. There, as part of their supportive activities on behalf of Israel, "Israeli Product Fairs" are held, at which imports - foods and other merchandise - are sold at ridiculously low prices.

Local merchants who carry Israel products sometimes complain to Israel trade officers that importers bypass them and sell directly to the organizers of these fairs. This leave them (the shop owners) with piles of unsold

Israel goods.
One Ministry official puts it this way "Our arm should not be to locate Jewish customers for Israel products, but to convince them to join other people in buying them — in the normal channels of distribution,"

Mapam: Tax returns should be published

By DAVID KRIVINE

NINANCE Minister Sapir has dropped the idea of publishing list of everybody's tax returns . but Knesset Member Dov Zakin, Mapam's spokesman on tax affairs, has not given up hope.

"It is necessary to supplement administrative sanctions by morel and social pressures," he told The Jerusalem Post last week. 'People who live well will not want to be shown up before the public as paying a minute tax," he said.

This view is supported by a sub committee (under Dr. Fanya Ginor) of the Asher Committee on Tax Reform. Its recommendation that tax lists be published will be studied by the plenum of the Asher committee at one of its coming meetings. Should the sub-committee's recommendation be adopted, this would create a confrontation with the Finance Minister — who is himself backed by tax experts in his Ministry.

They say that it takes time to complete assessments, particularly in questionable cases. An up-to-date list of all returns could be achieved only six years after the tax-year in question, by which time the inin question, by which time the information would be obsolete.





Dialogue with American Jewry

THE special session in Israel this week of the Presidents' Conference of 30 major American Jewish organizations is a new departure. While these leaders of the American Jewish community have for the most part visited Israel frequently in their individual capacities, the Presidents' Conference as a collective body has never done so.
This group represents the overwhelming majority of America's six million Jews. It does so in a manner which preserves the constituent organizations. Inevitably this involves a loose-ness of structure and modulated thrust, but this is the price paid for bringing together the wide spectrum of views and interests — secular and religious — that comprise the American Jewish

community.
Yet on issues which touch the core of Jewish welfare and sur-vival it is the Fresident's Con-ference, since its establishment in 1955, which has been able to muster American Jewry into a single voice. It has, for example, consistently played a key role in expressing to the U.S. Government the sentiments and in-terests of American Jewry re-garding issues which directly affect Israel.

This has involved a continuous and close partnership with Is-rael, but it also raises questions about the nature of that partnership, which gained expression in yesterday's meetings of the Conference. For while American Jewish leaders are prepared to see that Israel must be permit-ted to define its own needs and interests, they also, as Jews and as Jewish leaders, demand to

be heard. This of course is a justified demand: the decisions taken in Israel also affect Jews the world over. While meeting this demand would undoubtedly broaden the scope of debate, which in Jewish life is never modest in any case, the burden of doing so rests on American Jewry itself. For it is precisely the division in American Jewish organizational life and the common median tional life and the common readiness to limit direct involvement with Israel to philanthropy and tourism which has prevented a more intense dialogue.
Thus while there may be

some justice in the criticism voiced in the Conference session yesterday that Israeli leaders are not willing to listen to stric-tures coming from the Diaspora, the answer is that American Jewry should shout louder. For it is intensity of concern that is the mark of identification. And it is in such intensification of concern that the future of

both Jewish unity and align lie. Certainly if the President's Conference session in Israel fosters greater understanding not only of Israel's problems but of the forces in American Jewish life which have prevented such strengthening of concern it will have amply served our common

Syria: from caution to brinkmanship

THE repercussions of the classes along the Syrian-Israel border may well determine . the immediate future of the political efforts to find a peaceful Israel-Arab settlement. Indeed, developments depend largely on whether Damascus chooses to maintain the cease-

fire or abandon it.
Syria's Ba'ath Party regime headed by
President Hafez Assad, this month marked the second anniversary of the bloodless coup in which it seized power from the extreme leftist wing of the same party. Until the recent series of flare-ups the regime had demon-strated a good deal of caution and reasonableness towards the conflict with israel, despite its declared tough line of policy. For some time, Assad's government of relatively young, "technocrais" concentrated on consolidating Syria's national, social and economic fronts, shattered as a result of the numerous coups and counter coups which plagued that country for the previous two decades. This corresponded with surprising promotion of dip-lomatic contacts with West European coun-tries and a mild tone in discussing the Middle East conflict, all the more striking after Syria's previous insistence on a "popular armed struggle" to wipe out the existence of the State of Israel.

Late last summer, however, there was a sudden change, mainly as a result of two major outside factors. One of these was Damascus' involvement in a federation with Egypt and Libya, both of whom wanted to strengthen the loose union in time for its first anniversary. They sought to do this by re-viving the Israel-Arab conflict through the reactivation of the Palestinian terrorist movement. The terrorists themselves took refuge in Syria after Israel's massive crackdown in southern Lebanon (where the terrorists con-centrated after being expelled from Jordan.)

Links with Moscow

The second factor was Syria's coordination with the Soviet Union. This increased late last summer as Moscow hurried to consolidate its presence in both Syria and Iraq, in search of a substitute to Egypt, which expelled the Russians from its territory last July.

Both factors eventually had grave consequences for Syria's Middle East outlook. The terrorists involved that country in border confrontations with Israel, and the Soviets provided her and the terrorists with armaments and political backing against Israel.

There are some 6,000 active terrorists in Syria today. The bulk are stationed in the south and the south-east. Syria also plays host to about half of the 6,000-strong, but ineffectual Palestine Liberation Army (P.L.A.)

Syria has in fact developed into the main terrorist base. Libya sends contingents there, from among the 8,000 saboteurs whom the regime of Colonel Mu'ammer Gaddan has been MIDDLE EAST

training for a "liberation war" against Israel. These terrorists included field saboteurs who were sent to operate on the "front" in the ranks of the Fatah and others who were dispatched to earry out anti-Israel attacks abroad within the framework of the Fatah-affiliated "Black September" organization.

Syria has also been bolstering its 110,000-strong army through a stepped-up flow of Soviet equipment. The main aim seems to be raising the Syrian ability, both on the ground and in the air, to counter Israel's operations against increased terrorist activity from Syria. In this context, the Soviets were recently reported to be flying into Syria considerable quantities of SAM 2 and 3 anti-aircraft missiles. Damascus is known to have had eight batteries of missiles before the Odessa-Damascus to Paradian anti-aircraft missiles before the Odessa-Damascus to Paradian anti-aircraft anticus airlifts, which the Russians carried out last September and last week.

Flow of arms

The Soviets were at the same time reported to be exchanging Syria's 80 MIG 17 jet fighters for MIG 21s to improve the combat capability of the 10,000-man Air Force, which possesses about 300 warplanes, already including some 100 MIG 21s. The Soviets have also introduced sophisticated armaments into Syria's armoured forces, which has over a thousand tanks, including T54s, T55s, and SU100s, and the artillery corps which includes field guns of 120mm, 130mm and 152mm, and anti-aircraft guns of 37mm, 57mm 85mm and 100mm There have also been supplies of unspecified equipment for the relatively small, 2,000-man, navy. Syria is reported to have allocated some \$250m. for its build-up.

Apart from the flow of Soviet arms, there have been reports indicating that Egypt has placed some of its MIG 21 combat planes stationed in Syria at the disposal of the Damascus military command.
Egypt is under the pressure internal politi-

cal ferment and the transfer of planes can be seen as its attempt to show that it is contributing to the fight against Israel without subjecting itself to the risk of an immediate confrontation, which Cairo can hardly afford in her present shaky state.

Apparently without calculating the consequences of escalating tension, Egypt wants to keep the confrontation with Israel live on other Arab fronts, with an eye to the U.N. debate on the Middle East, next week.

May I say that a comparison be-tween the situation in the two wastern countries and that in Isrei can, not be meaningful if only for the reason that the two Western democracies are countries at peace or at least countries involved in military action outside of their own territory, while Israel is at war notwithstand

ing the uneasy cease-dire.

The terrorists are working recording to carefully laid plans of
warfare which follow this general

1. Hit and run attacks at places where large numbers of civilians are gathering, such as markets, department stores, buses including school

2. Planting of time bombs in pub-lic places like railway stations, bus terminals, etc.

3. Hijacking of airplanes with subsequent demands of release of prisoners legally sentenced to prison terms because of their proven par-ticipation in terrorist activities.

The only tenable answer to acts of war of this kind must be to introduce martial law under which any person accused of terrorist activity has to come before a military tribunal within 24 hours after being apprehended. If the tribunal finds the accused guilty, the death penalty should be mandatory whenever the action of the defendant or one of his unapprehended accomplices has caused the death of any of the victims. The death sentence should be executed at once. The alternative to the death penalty must be a verdict

of acquittal. Persons concerned with the pos-sibility that a defendent could be the victim of an error of judgment and that the execution of an erroneous death sentence is not re versible, may bear in mind that the death of the innocent victim is not reversible either, and that quite often hits the innocent and the

They also may keep in mind that a great many innocents would be saved just by depriving the terrorists of objects to barter for. If there had not been jalled guerrilla's in Israel the eleven murdered Olympic athletes might still be alive and so might be the young woman passenger who died on the hijsoked Belgian strings in May of this year.

This Talmudic description of shocked reaction is most appropriate to the current feeling in Israeli religious circles regarding the lightning, exhibitionist opera-tion of Chief Rabbi Shlomo Goren in legitimizing Hanoch and Miriam Langer the brother and sister who been prevented from marryn by the ruling handed down by a district rab-binical court, and upheld by the Supreme Religious Court, that they were mamserim.

It is not the intention of this article to touch on the halachic aspects of the case, since I am not the authority to pass judg-ment on the steps taken by Rab-bi Goren towards the legitimization and marriages of the Langers. But I cannot refrain from commenting on the bad taste which characterized the entire operation.

Rabbi Goren grave error in bringing Defence Minister Moshe Dayan to the Langer wedding, implicitly in-dicating that the same talents for strategy, surprise and secret swiftness which Mr. Dayan has used for military coups were used by the new Chief Rabbi in pulling off this rabbinical coup. Such methods gain glory when used for military triumphs; in rabbinical matters they can earn' only infamy.

Cheap act

Even the secularists who cheer ed Rabbi Goren's action saw the cheap exhibitionism of the opera-First came his attempt to force Chief Rabbi Ovadia Yosef into cooperation. This was fol-lowed by a statement that he would not agree to an installation ceremony until the mamzerim problem was solved as he had romised. While building up to his move he held meetings with young Mapan members and handed out secret promises to the Independent Liberals that the problems of marriages forbidden by halacka would be solved. Chimaxing all this was a lighting, undercover move together with judges whose identities he refused to disclose, a move which ignored the rulings of the District and Supreme Rabbinical courts, a move for which he quickly pre-



pared sensational coverage by the press, radio and television. A serious problem now faces religious Jewry in Israel. Something historically grave has transpired and we are forced to consider steps which will provide not merely temporary solutions but a long-range plan of action.
