Israel is expected to meet the terrorists on their own terms h order to combat the rising wave of terror, using tactics which would be both unconventional and damaging. At the same time, Israel's security forces must be on the defensive, taking maximum precautions to ensure the safety of Israelis and Israel property abroad.





Americans support Nixon's war

Louis Harris opinion poli said yesterday that American voters prefer President Nixon's conduct of the Vietnam War to Sen. George McGovern's proposals for ending it.

According to the poll, likely voters support the President in his heavy bombing of North Vietnam by 55 per cent to 32 per cent and the mining of North Vietnamese harbours 64 per cent to 22 per cent.

His task is to destroy a powerful dope and prostitution ring, fronted by a meat processing factory, which is headed by the incongruously named Mary Anne, played with relish by Gene Hackman.







UTOPIA CHALLENGED

THE coming election campaign is sprouting in many places. An ardent campaigner for some months past has been Mr. Lyova Eliav. former Labour Party

secretary.
Mr. Eliav has set out his views in his book "The Land of Splendour." It is a latter-day Utopia, arguing ultimately that Israel might become the perfect land if we will withdraw from administered territories, help in the creation of an independent Arab area in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, linked or not linked with Jordan as circumstances may dictate, and, incidentally, avoid the social, ideological and practical difficulties that are created by close contact with a large Arab population— even, apparently, the kind of contact that exists now.

There is a simple counter-argument that says that this was the position from 1948 to 1967, that there was no Utopia. not at home and certainly not on the borders, but two decades of intermittent warfare which made it impossible to give sufficient attention to pressing do-mestic problems that have only become fully visible now because we are no longer threatened by war at home. For two or three years Egypt's President Sadat might maintain his present precarious position by claiming that it was his determined stand that had wrested such a victory as full withdrawal from Israel, but after?

A far more important and significant argument today is that it is precisely the co-existence with the Arabs of the West Bank and opportunities for contact that have led to the very notable relaxation of tension be-tween Israel and Jordan. There is a growing realization that it was the fact of the sealed and closely defended borders that caused hostility to build up, and that we must not shut ourselves away again from our neighbours, whatever the difficulties involved. In any case, co-existence and

gradual feelers towards a permanent arrangement, together with the retention of military forces on the Jordan and at Sharm e-Sheikh and in the Golan Heights, are official Labour policy. When it was first formulated as the "oral policy" by Defence Minister Dayan in 1968, Foreign Minister Eban was known not to be happy with it, but he has since enunciated most of its terms himself on various occasions. There is certainly a group within the Alignment party cadres which favours a minimalist stance, and Finance Minister Sapir gives it his support though not necessarily to the one-man organization of Mr.

Mr. Eliav is lecturing to party branches on his ideas, and says with engaging openness that he hopes very much to be a member of the next Cabinet in 1973. Deputy party secretary Mor-dechai Surkiss, who holds views opposed to those of Mr. Eliav, has protested hotly that the Labour information organization has no right to push Mr. Eliav's book and views if they do not also push the opposing view: he will succeed in this only if he can mobilize speakers to do the job.

Inside the party echelons, as inside its magazine "Ot," a chance appointment, or even Mr. Sapir's great personal and or-ganizational influence, can make great deal of difference, and Mr. Eliav without any doubt be-Mr. Eliav without any doubt be-lieves what he says when he deciares that "most of the party is behind me." Within the party organization he will certainly mobilize support from those who seek an ideology to fit their


