AMERICA'S SHIFT

"It would be wishful thinking to expect any diminution of the American role at this critical stage of negotiations," writes RAYMOND TANTER in an analysis of the American position on the Arab-Israel conflict over the past 30 years in which the superpower has moved from benign neglect to full partnership in the shaping of events.

Profit-takers drive linked bond prices down

TEL AVIV. — The index-linked bond market registered losses of up to 2 per cent yesterday as profit-taking moved prices lower.

In the two preceding sessions various index-linked bonds had gained as much as 5 per cent, one of the sharpest two-session rises recorded this year.

Trading volume in bonds was relatively low at IL42.7m.
