Sound Stavisky Ruling In declaring the Stavisky-Goodman Law invalid, State
Supreme Court Justice Abraham J. Gellinoff has overturned a legislative act that ignored the, city's fiscal plight which other measures
lature have tried to remedy.
As originally cooceived, the bill was intended as a
ound reminder to city Hall that, merely because other municipal services, and particularly the uniformed ones, enjoy more vocal suppport, the schbots must not be made
to bear an inordinate weight of the retrencment buro a scenario that left only two unacceptable cboices: bankruptcy for th
othar services.
Although Judge Gellinoff based his ruling largely on in the manner in wbicb the law was enacted, the deision's practical-and salutary-effect at the moment is that it blocks a disastrous fiscal course. The Board of Teachers, plans to appeal the ruling. A more sensible course would be to assess the avaliable funds and to work out an educational action plan that uses those funds most productively, aiming at the best possible
services to chiddren while preventing as many teacher layoffs as feasible.

Like the pesticide DDT, whicb bas now been banned PCBs are not biodegradable. They persist in the food river, they are ingested by fish, consumed by bumans and in a recent authenticated case wiere found to have been transmitted to a newborn baby through the moth ers
House aproving toe toxic substances bill this week, the House of a representatives added an amendment tha establishes important new procedures enabling the Envi ronmental Protection Agency to regulate potentially dangerous chemicals. Three months before marketing a new chemical or proposing a "signiflcant new use" fo an existing substance, a chemical manufacturer would the chemical to tests for safey Pre-martess screening is be heart of the law. Chemicals should be fully tested and the risks impartally evaluated before-not afterthey have entered the marketplace.
The bill passed by the House is a somewhat different version of a measure approved by the Senate in March This is the third consecutive Congress in which both
houses have approved different versions of a toxic substances control bill. Four years ago, the bills died in the rush to edjournment. Two years ago, a protracted conference failed to reach agreement because a weak House bill failed to provide the pre-narket screening safeguards ferees refused to yield
