STATE NEWS

Committees at Bluefield, have completed arrangements for the entertainment of the Knights of Pythias grand lodge, which will be held August 29 and 30. Two hundred and thirty-four subordinate lodges will be represented.

Charleston was selected as the place for holding the 1918 meeting at the annual convention of the West Virginia Business Men's Association in Clarksburg. L. P. Souders, Martinsburg, was elected president.

Creditors of Josiah V. Thompson, of Untongtown, are asking if the delays in the proceedings for the sale of his 8,000 acres of Monongalia coal lands will leave anything. It is said the interest alone is amounting to \$7,000 a day, \$200 an hour or \$5 a minute.

The Gratton postoffice has received three full carloads of over 10,000,000 postcards and envelopes for distribution from the depository there. Pittsburgh, Chicago and other large cities, received shipments from this allotment.

A vigorous campaign is being made at Buckhannon, and throughout Upshur county to arouse interest in the improvement of certain roads over which United States mail routes are maintained to prevent the discontinuance of the route service.

Shipment of intoxicating liquor in trunks, which are checked as baggage by Harrison county authorities and state prohibition officers considerable trouble. When those who call for the trunks fail to find them, they destroy their checks, thus eliminating all evidence against them.

Joe Izzie, two-year-old son of Dan Izzie, of Monongalia, died, being the first victim of the infantile paralysis epidemic which prevails in that locality. The child was paralyzed in the back and sides. The hospital for the unfortunate children afflicted was opened at Monongalia with special nurses from New York City in charge.

Walter Adkins, 29, one of two men arrested for failure to register after United States Marshal Osborne stormed a barricaded mountain house in Wayne county in which Adkins and his brother were in hiding, will be in Wayne county's first quota to be sent to the training camp. His number, 1878, was the fourth one drawn.

A state campaign to conserve the food supply by a more extended use of skim milk, buttermilk and cottage cheese was started in Clarksburg, by Charles S. Trimble of Washington, D. C., dairy expert in the United States department of agriculture. After a stay in Clarksburg he will visit other cities in the state.

Morgan Dale Orr, aged 76, leading coal operator and business man of Fairmont, is dead. He was the first mayor of Fairmont and had spent practically his entire life in that city. He leaves a wife and four children. Mr. Orr served in the Union army until he was wounded in the battle of Crossing Keys.

The county court of Monroe county, has chosen Jack W. Hancock, of Charleston, as county road engineer, to have charge of a large amount of road construction that is in prospect at Union. The court has established Class A roads, and is preparing to inaugurate the patrol system of keeping up its roads.

Two sisters were drowned while wading in the Ohio river near Wellsburg. Mrs. Lee McDonald aged 22 and Miss Susie Green aged 18. Mrs. McDonald sacrificed her life in an effort to save her sister. Mrs. Anna Porter saved her daughter and another girl from the same fate. All reside in Wellsburg.

Officers of employees of the City of Wheeling who enlist or are drafted for military service during the war will have their dependent relatives cared for by the city, according to the provisions of a resolution introduced in council. An ordinance embodying the provisions of the resolution was ordered prepared.

The Women's club of Fairmont, has made formal request of the city board of affairs that the board appoint a policeman on the police force of the city. The board of affairs recently appointed a municipal housekeeper, whose duties it will be to inspect city markets and produce houses monthly, and to report existing conditions as to sanitation to the board.

Plans are being made by the county agricultural agent of Braxton county, P. H. Curtis, to hold a boys camp near Sutton, some time in the month of August, at which all the boys between the ages of 9 and 18 will be invited to attend. The camp, which will be held for a day and a night, is for the purpose of deepening the interest of boys in agricultural pursuits.

The state road commission has announced that it will begin at once the prosecution of violators of two specific provisions of the road law relating to automobiles. One of these is the failure of automobile owners to take out a license, the other the failure to attach the tags, one at the front the other at the rear of the car, as specified.

Representatives of railroads doing an intrastate business in West Virginia appeared before the Public Service Commission and asked that they be granted permission to put the fifteen cent first class freight rate into effect within five days in conformance with the increase granted recently by the Interstate Commerce Commission. The Public Service Commission has taken the matter under consideration.

The state board of control has announced that it will proceed at once to rearrange the interior of the other buildings at West Virginia College to make room for the departments of domestic science and arts, the quarters of which were destroyed by fire recently.

Announcement was made in Charleston, to the effect that Dr. H. L. Robertson's brother, Captain C. E. Robertson, who is flight commander of Canadian aviators in France, had been reported among those missing after an intensive air raid over the German lines. It is not known whether he was killed or taken prisoner by the Germans.
