## FIELD NOTES

Saturday was opening day of the squirrel hunting season. Almost every one got their limit of six squirrels and that before breakfast too. I would adventure the estimate of the kill in the thousands. Not in twenty years have squirrels been more plentiful. Nearly all those killed are young male squirrels. I have not made up my mind how the unusual abundance of squirrels is to be accounted for—whether by migration or reproduction. Last winter was mild and no squirrels froze to death in their den trees. There was plenty of food and everything was favorable for the raising of large families. Under the leadership of the Marlinton Rod and Gun Club, with its varmint killing contests, the sportsmen played havoc

with weazels, hawks and other squirrel eaters. Any way, the squirrels are back again in great numbers, and there is much for them to eat. At present, they are working on the great crop of hickory nuts.  
If you have lost your hunting and tagging license, it is just too bad. Formerly the obliging county clerk could issue a duplicate, but not now. A letter from the Chief Game Protector brings the information that the law prohibits the issuing of a duplicate license, and the only alternative is to secure another license.
