Task Force—Code of Ethics

A meeting was held in Charleston Monday morning at the call of Governor-elect Hulett Smith to study conflicts of interest in state government and prepare some recommendations for the Legislature. Your editor was honored with an invitation to be among the twenty-four persons asked to serve. This is a delicate and difficult business. There are laws covering actual dishonesty, such as bribery, embezzlement, etc. Also there are rules that apply to county and municipal officials, boards of education, and a few others with regards to their business dealings. But for the most part there are no guidelines for state officials or employees. Most officials would welcome a code of ethics to guide their decisions in regard to their business holdings. Of course, a legislator must do something else to earn a living and a person may serve in office for four years and then return to private life. There is a real problem for some people serving in public office.

It takes capable business people to fill many state positions. As one man stated Monday, he had definite views about conflict of interest but he also wanted good business people taking care of his tax money.

Everyone agreed it is impossible to legislate morality but there is a need for some general rulings. It is a new field—only about ten states have such legislation.

On Monday Bernard Jacobson, former vice-president of the F.M.C. Corporation, was elected chairman. A review was given to members to study and information will be obtained from other states.

Jet Propulsion

Jet propulsion, which has enabled some airplanes to travel faster than speed of sound, is over 2,200 years old, and is not so difficult to understand after having seen Previews of Progress, the famed General Motors science stage show which was presented at Marlinton High on Monday, December 14.

Designed to stimulate interest in research and engineering, Previews seeks to inspire students to science careers.

Joe Shaw, one of two traveling lecturers, explained the origin of jet propulsion by demonstrating the aeolipile, invented about 200 B.C. by the Greek philosopher, Hero. The "Ball of the Winds," uses steam as an energy source and is generally regarded as the world's first jet engine.

The audience was quickly returned to the twentieth century by the non-miniature roar of a tiny pulse jet engine which has been the delight of young and old from coast to coast, then one of the recent applications of jet propulsion—the gas turbine engine which is used in the Firebird III experimental gas turbine car.

Eight other demonstrations of new developments in science and engineering were included in the fast-moving stage show. This is one of seven teams presenting Previews of Progress to nearly two million persons each year in all sections of the United States.
