III. THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE In the year of our Lord nineteen undred and one a large aud im nt deliberative b nbled in the city of Charleston The occasion was one of internsional importance and the press of all nations discussed the possible affect of the congress. It was the first annual Conference of the Justices of West Virginia, and the thrones of Europe creaked through the uneasy movements of their occupants, who were anxiously waiting the result.

This new force was brought into play' by the suggestion that the ustices meet for concerted action. and over five hundred magistrates from the different counties gather-ed in Charleston. The trains were crowded with them and the botel people were paralyzed. Never had the city seen such dignity and protentous gravity, and the justices had the liberty of the town. When
