

### A TRIBUTE OF RESPECT

These lines are written in loving respect to the memory of Mrs. Mary Serene Lovelidge Clark, of Lovelidge, W. Va., who on October 20, 1920, at Kellam Hospital, Richmond, Va., arrived at the terminus of a long earthly life of 84 years nearly completed and entered into life eternal. The bliss of which we are ignorant she testified during her illness of it being well with her soul. She had been a member of the Presbyterian church for many years.

The writer isn't well enough informed of her life to give the details in full but knows of her early home being in the state of Connecticut and her education was received in some of her home institutions of learning, and she bore all through her life the impress of refinement and culture and when we looked on her quiet face in her casket we observed that impress was yet there.

She was the widow of Henry N. Clark, who died in 1902, and was the mother of nine children, of which only four survive her: Rev. R. H. Clark of Kincaid, W. Va., R. C. and Peter of Lovelidge and Ryece of New Haven, Conn. One son, Sheldon, died in early manhood and one son and her three daughters died in infancy and early childhood. We were comforted by the knowledge that although Mrs. Clark had no daughter of her own to care for her during her illness, that some other mothers girls have been brought from Richmond, Va., and on Friday a number of relatives and friends gathered at the Presbyterian church at Hillsboro where her funeral services were conducted by Rev. J. C. Johnson, and her earthly remains were taken from thence to the family graveyard on the old Clark estate and there laid to rest by the side of her husband and other loved ones.

The writer feels in the departure of this lady that her earthly friends number one less but is comforted by knowing that there is one more tie on the "other side" and one more that is safely housed from the storms and turmoils of this earthly life.

There are many others than her own family and relatives that are touched and bereaved by her going home but we should be consoled by believing that it is well with her. May God's comforting grace abound to all the bereaved ones.

To The People of West Virginia:

All history makes it clear that no nation need expect either a high degree of personal efficiency or general happiness without a good system of public schools. From the first education has been regarded as the bulwark of our own democracy. But at the present moment school systems everywhere are in distress and thoughtful men are alarmed over the situation. Schools are without teachers and some rural schools have been closed two or even three years in succession. Our school authorities have lowered standards in order to increase the supply of teachers, but in vain. Citizens are making frantic appeals for teachers but none are obtainable. We are not alone in our trouble. Other states are no better off. The problem is not one that teachers and school officers alone may solve. It has grown beyond their reach. Accordingly, I am responding to the request of the United States Commissioner of Education, Doctor P. P. Claxton, approved by the conference of school superintendents recently held in Parkersburg, and designating December 5-11 as a special "school week" for West Virginia, and I here by call upon all good citizens who believe in education and have the welfare of the state at heart to respond to the call for cooperation in this effort to put the facts before the people and to devise some means of remedying the present conditions which in some sections of the state are intolerable.

I would respectfully request that all ministers of the state preach on education on Sunday, December 5th. That other religious organizations, Young Men's and Women's Christian Associations, Young Men's and Women's Hebrew Associations, Knights of Columbus and Young People's Associations in the churches should devote their meetings on this day to discussions of the value of education and urge upon young people the importance of their taking advantage of all possible opportunities for increase of knowledge and the perfecting of their training.

That during the week all women's clubs, parent-teacher associations, chambers of commerce, boards of trade, Kiwanis and Rotary clubs and other important organizations, labor unions, farmers unions and all patriotic and civic societies devote one meeting to a discussion of the needs of education in their State and local communities, holding special meetings for this purpose. If necessary, that moving picture houses put on the screens that week facts and figures in regard to the importance of education and the conditions and needs of the schools. That in the university, colleges and normal schools the convocation hours of the week be devoted to a discussion of education in general and of their own particular needs.

That all elementary and high school teachers devote one period during each day of the week to this subject, telling the children about education in their local communities and in State and Nation, how the schools are supported and how money is spent for them, their economic, social and civic value and other facts of interest.

That all schools and debating societies holding meetings during the week take for their subject of debate some topic relating to education in local community, city, county or State.

To the end that there may be a revival of interest in education, an improvement in conditions and a sufficient number of competent teachers to supply our public schools.

### PRICES IN 1845

In the Lexington, (Va.) Gazette's 75-year ago column we find the following statement of prevailing price in the Lexington market in the month of November, 1845, and have no doubt that about the same prices prevailed in Lewisburg at that time:

Flour, \$3.50 a barrel; buckwheat flour \$2.00 a hundred weight; corn 50c a bushel; Irish potatoes 50c a bushel; sweet potatoes, 75c a bushel; turnips 30c a bushel; apples 50c a bushel; pumpkins 10c to 20c according to size; chickens 8 to 12 1/2c, according to size and fatness; turkeys 25 to 35c; eggs 8c a dozen; butter 12c a pound; North River fish 25c to 35c a string. Squirrels, rabbits, partridges, coons and opossums in abundance, are to be found through out Rockbridge, but none in the market.—Greenbrier Independent.

The Federal Government has caused to be made Victory Medals for all men who served their country in the Great War. The distribution of these rewards of gallantry have been greatly retarded because of the inaccessibility of many of the ex-service men. Colonel Woodson, in charge of the recruiting station for this district, stationed at Huntington, has appealed to me to aid in bringing this matter to the attention of the men who are entitled to the medals.
