"There is an atmosphere o public opinion that causes a schoo system to blossom and be fruitful," and unless this exists the school system soon loses the life which it seems to have. A great New England statesmen once said that there was not one single element of civilization that was not made in the end to depend upon public opinion.

A school may have good super vision, good teachers, and many of the requirements of good schools, but unless the interest and confidence of the people are enlisted so that they believe in the value of what is done, much of the labor goes for nothing.

The school itself may influence public opinion, and, indeed, the school is largely responsible for the atmosphere of public opinion in which it lives.

One of the very strongest fac tors in maintaining good schools is a broad educational policy and sentiment in a vicinity. for if there is the slightest variation in the work of the school and a bad administration secures control this policy and sentiment will not rest until the school is made good.

The principal factors that contribute to education in the community are "the church, the home, the school, the public library, the newspaper, the art museum where the Presbyterian church in the there is one, and the civil state with its laws protecting life and property." .
