The attention of all parties who have been cutting timber on the telephone lines or other property belonging to the Knapps Creek and Dilley's Mill Mutual Telephone Company is called to the following Statute: "Any person who shall willfully or maliciously destroy, or remove any of the wires, poles, or other property or material belonging to any telegraph, telephone, or railroad company, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding twelve months, and by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, at the discretion of the court. Such person shall also be liable in a civil action for all damages to such property caused by such destruction or injury."
