STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION CHARLESTON. A meeting of the PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION, held on Monday, the 20th day of April, A. D. 1915, No. 371. IN THE MATTER OF THE PETITION OF THE CHESAPEAKE & OHIO RAILWAY COMPANY FOR INCREASE OF ITS PASSENGER RATES. THIS DAY came the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company and tendered, in triplicate, to the Commission its Petition accompanied by exhibits, praying that it be allowed to increase its passenger rates in West Virginia on its main line and its branch lines, from two cents to at least two and one-half cents per mile, and the same having been seen and inspected is ordered to be filed; and THE COMMISSION having considered the matter here involved, it is ordered that The Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company shall show cause for the requested increase in rates, and this matter is set down for hearing on the 11th day of May, 1915. And the petitioner shall forthwith give the notice required by law, by the publication of this order in at least one newspaper of general circulation in each county through which the lines of the petitioner run in West Virginia.
