Among several of the points of defense was that the body found in the woods was not that of the missing man John Moslo, who was last seen in company of the prisoner. One of the most damning bits of evidence also as an interpretor. His evidence was to the effect that the name on the paper was the name of a sister of John Moslo, and by a strange coincidence, he the witness had been with Moslo a short time before he disappeared, and that he had seen Moslo write that name on that piece of paper in his presence, and that evidence could not be shaken.

There was no time during the trial to investigate this point of evidence and the trial resulted in a verdict of guilty and the unfortunate defendant was sentenced to serve for life in the
