CCC CAMPS

Construction of new camps and rehabilitation of abandoned camps to be occupied by newly created companies of the CCC under the expansion program, is progressing at a rapid rate and it is expected that all camps will be in location by the latter part of August.

Construction foremen are now at camps F. 2, Randolph County; F. 16, Webster county; P-55, Boone County; P-56, Pocahontas County; P-37, Greenbrier county; P-59, Kanawha county and S-61 in Wayne county. Local skilled mechanics are used, under supervision of the foremen. In the construction of these camps, detachments of CCC enrollees being used for unskilled labor necessary.

One company of CCC enrollees being used for unskilled labor necessary. One company of CCC enrollees is being transferred from London, Kentucky, leaving there on June 13, for their new location at Camp F 2, near Alpena, Randolph county.

An enrollment of replacement for CCC companies in the state will be conducted on June 25, at which time 510 junior enrollees, between the ages of eighteen and twenty eight years and 148 veterans will be accepted. The enrollment will be conducted by Regular Army and Reserve officers on duty with the CCC under the direction of Col. W. H. Waldron, U. S. A., Commanding Officer of the Charleston District CCC. Applicants for enrollment will be selected by the various Welfare Agencies and the veterans' administration.

At present sixteen camps are managed by CCC Companies. It is expected that eleven additional companies will have been organized by July 5.

Washington, D. C.—A report just released by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation reveals that twenty thousand depositors of closed insured banks have been paid their insured deposits in the first seventeen months of deposit insurance.

They were depositors in seventeen closed banks which the Insurance Corporation had taken over up to May 31, and their insured claims totaling more than two and a quarter million dollars. In all there have been 25,000 depositors in these banks whose estimated insured funds amount to two and one-half million dollars.

Payment of claims by the F. D. I. C. has started within an average time of a week of the day the banks closed, the report shows. It further reveals that in the last bank to be taken over by the Insurance Corporation all but sixty dollars of insured money has been paid to depositors. The pay off began on May 13 and all but twelve of its depositors had received a settlement of their claim on the last day of the month.

Approximate total deposits in all the closed banks are \$3,760,000. In addition to that the insured portion of that total of almost \$2,500,000 secured in full or was in preferred or secured deposits or was subject to offset so that there remain less than two hundred thousand dollars to be paid to depositors as liquidation of the assets of these banks is made.

It is estimated by officials of the Corporation that ninety-nine out of every hundred of the individual depositors in the closed insured banks have received all the money they had on deposit, or will receive it just as soon as they come to the banks. The F. D. I. C. is insuring deposits in 14,000 banks throughout the country at the present time. It has announced that this is ninety per cent of all licensed commercial banks and that they hold all but two per cent of the total bank deposits.
