The U. S. Labor Distribution Branch, located at No. 135 South Second Street, Philadelphia, Pa, and the sub-branch with offices in the Berger Building, Pittsburg, Pa, have been in operation about one year, the exact date of the official opening teing February 17, 1915.

"There is a noteworthy difference between conditions today and those of just twelve months ago, as applied to our labor distribu-

dered by this particular branch of work coming under his supervision. "A year ago," continued the Commissioner, "we were overwork and the opportunities for Marlinton, W. Va. employment at our disposal were quite limited, but things are quite different now. Opportunities are more plentiful and applicants fewer by far than a year ago.'

"Midwinter ordinarily finds large number of workers, particularly in unskilled lines, ou; of employment; this winter, however, is the demand for men in both skilled and unskilled lines. Right now we have opportunities for an unlimited number of coal miners and mine laborers for middle and wes tern Pennsylvania and West Virginia: 300 weavers for a large blanket, cloth and carpet mill in Philadelphia; 75 laborers for stone quarries in eastern Pennsylvania (Italians preferred;) 200 laborers for iron works outside of Philadelphia; unlimited number of expert machinists, domestics, etc. on the other hand we have many applications on file from persons whose qualifications unfit them for
