example of drowning a fish than this. In hooking a bass, the attractiveness of the sport depends apon the fighting qualities of the fish. That is the gentle art of angling. If the hook is fast in its mouth, the strain of the line forces its mouth open and an unusual quantity of water passes through its gills and literally drowns the fish as it is reeled in. There is no question as to this. Every bass fisherman knows it. If on the other hand the hook is swallowed and is fastened in the stomach of the bass, the fish lives longer and makes a much more prolonged fight for liberty.
