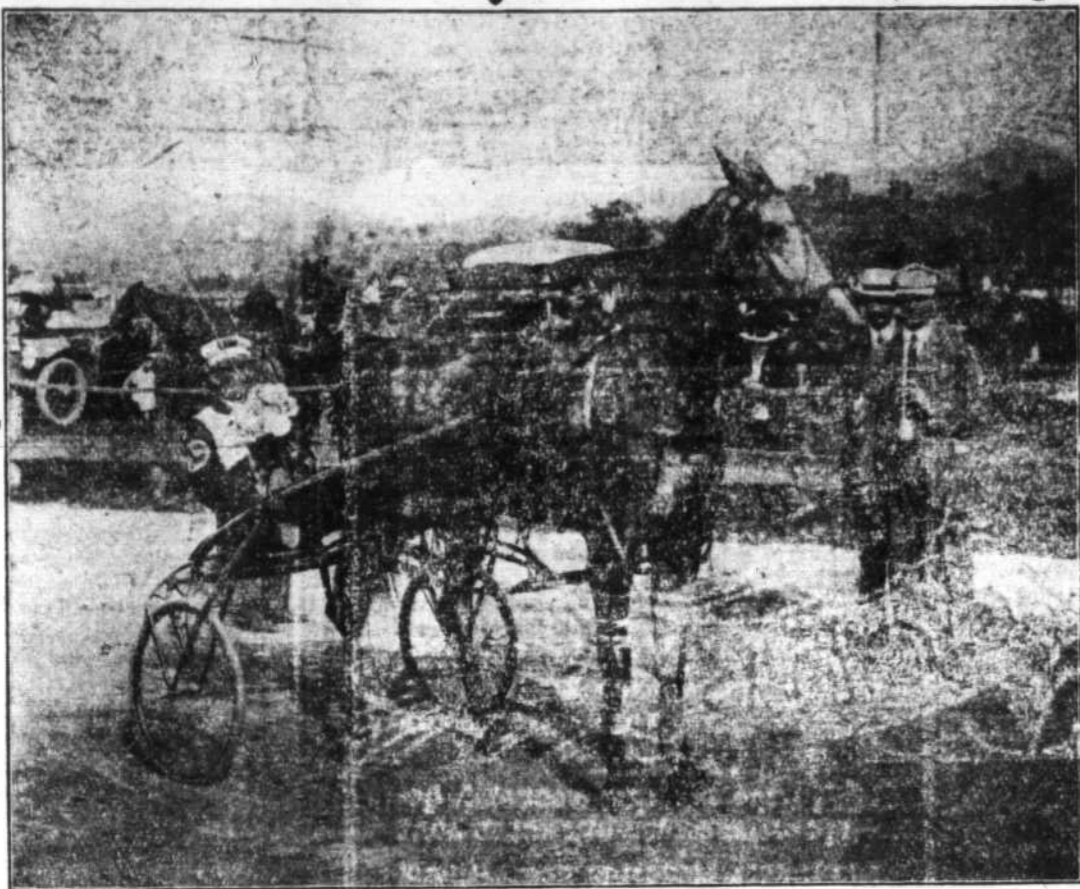

Notice of Bond Sale

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor and Council of the Town of Marlinton, West Virginia, will on

Monday, the 15th day of July, 1918, at eight o'clock p. m., at the Council Chambers in said Town of Marlinton, sit for the purpose of receiving sealed bids for the bond issue of said Town of Marlinton, dated July 1st, 1918, in the amount of ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars.

Said bonds are of the denomination of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars; bear interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable annually on the 1st day of January in each year upon the surrender of the respective interest coupons; are numbered from one to twenty, inclusive, Nos one and two maturing January 1st, 1929, and two bonds, in numerical order, on January 1st in each year thereafter until the issue is retired.

All bids for the above bonds must be in writing, must be sealed, and must be accompanied by certified check for 2 per cent of the amount of the bid, to be forfeited by the successful bidder in the event of his failure or refusal to comply with his purchase, the said certified check to be payable to the Treasurer of the Town of Marlinton; and the successful bidder will be required to pay the accrued interest from the date of said bonds until date of delivery.

No bid for less than par value will be considered by the Council, and the right is reserved to reject any and all bids.

SUGAR

Beginning with Monday, July first, householders will not be limited to one purchase of 25 pounds of sugar for canning and preserving purposes, as at present, but may purchase what they reasonably require, provided however that they will not be allowed to purchase more than 25 pounds at one time and will not be allowed to make more than one purchase of 25 pounds in any one week. The regular householder's certificate will be used as usual.

Retailers who disregard this rule will have their certificates cancelled and will not be allowed to purchase more sugar.

WARNING

On and after July 1st the following persons, places institutions and establishments will not be able to buy sugar except on certificates issued by the Federal Food Administrator, Wheeling:

1. Public eating places, including hotels, restaurants, public and other refreshment houses, dining cars, boats, clubs, buffets, caterers. City, County, State or Federal Institutions, hospitals, private canteens, interment camps, as well as all households, which regularly feed twenty-five persons or more whether members of the family or boarders.
2. Manufacturers of bakery products including bread, rolls, sweet yeast dough goods, crackers, biscuits, cookies, ice cream cones, cakes, pies, fried cakes, pastry, quick breads, Boston brown bread, batter cakes, waffles, etc.
3. Retailers selling for consumption all the foregoing must file with the Federal Food Administrator, Wheeling, W. Va., before July 15th statement setting forth their needs for July, August and September or certificates will not be issued to them for the remainder of the year.

Blank forms for making statements will be sent by mail from the Wheeling office to all those enumerated in 1 and 2 above. If blanks are not received for 1, 2, or 3, by July 10th write to the County Food Administrator for your County.

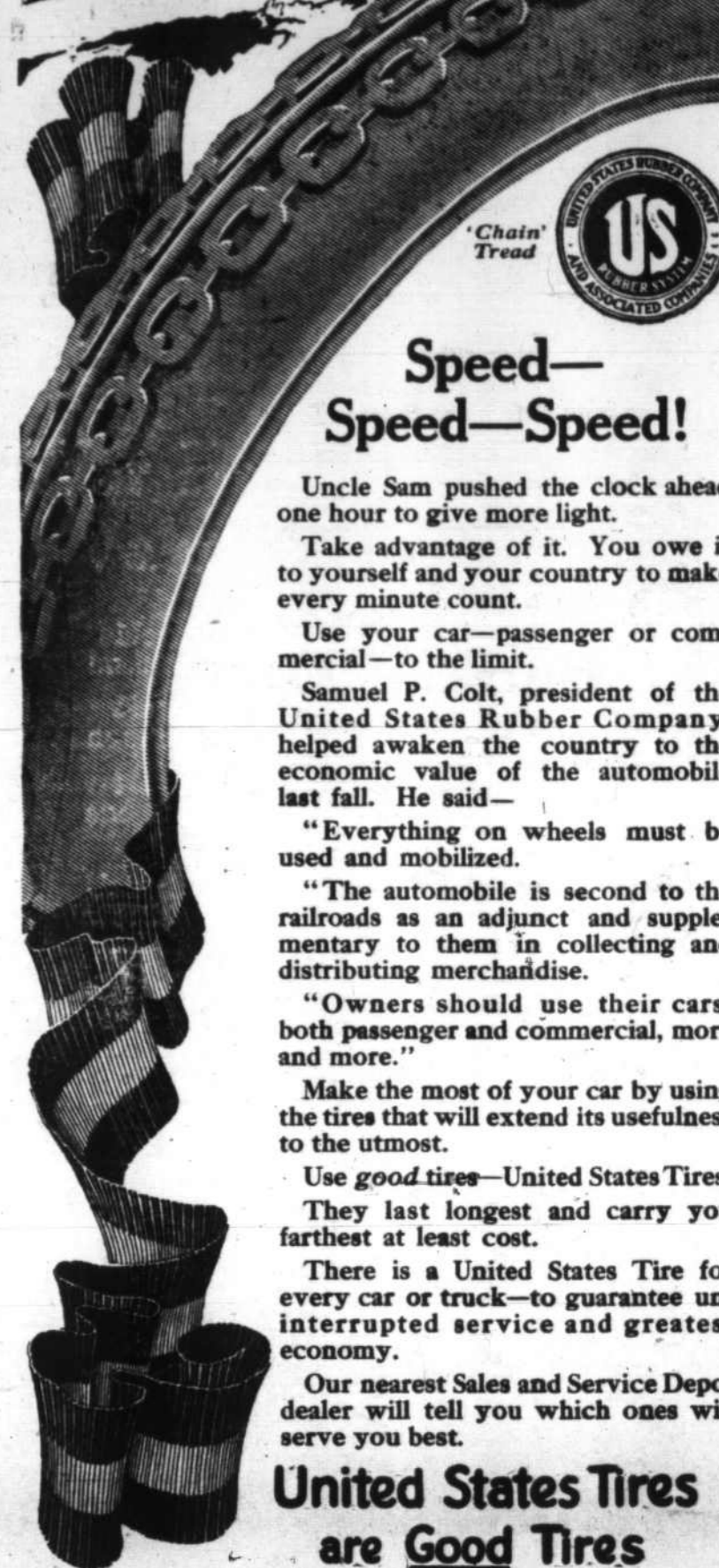
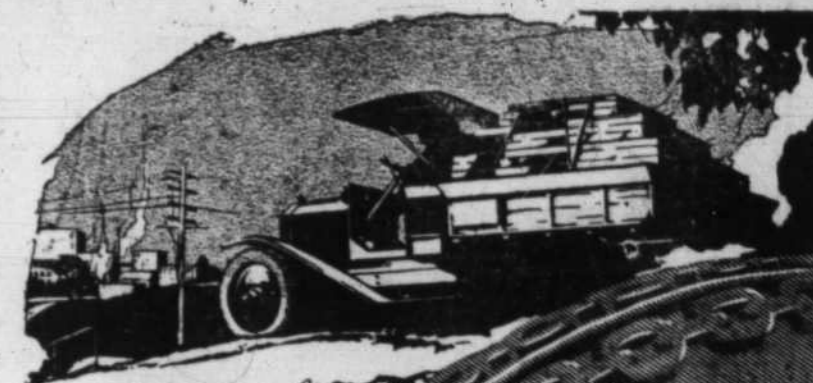

Shipping Board Recruiting Service, reports numerous inquiries from young men, who prefer serving their country in the great war on the sea rather than on land. Most of the would-be recruits want to know what the pay is really training. They are informed that it is \$30 a month plus board and lodging, and the use of the uniform.

After approximately two months on a training ship, the Merchant Marine recruits are placed in the crews of cargo or passenger vessels, for mercantile voyages to various quarters of the globe. They are exempted from military service. Mr. Waugh has already forwarded two young men from Pocahontas to this service: Wm. H. Sheets of Dummore and Harper Barrett of Marlinton, both have been accepted and are now in training.
