The failure to have a license when hunting is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars and at the discretion of the court confinement in jail. Failure to produce tht license or wear the tag while hunting is in itself a violation. Section 6 of the bill of rights provides that citizens shall be secure in their houses, persons, papers, and effects, from unreasonable searches and seizures, and in this respect their rights shall not be violated. Mark you that it does not say unlawful searches and seizures; it says unreasonable. Query, then: With such a provision in the constitution can the legislature pass such a law unless there be good reason? The constitution controls the legislature.

If the law produced a revenue, it might be reasonable. But being merely a police measure to inconvenlence the innocent that some possible violator might be detected, it strikes us as being a statue of the legislature seeking to make legal unreasonable searches and seizures.
