Charleston.—Speeders are having a lot of trouble these days with the police department, for the police have started out to round them up, one and all. This is the result of orders from Mayor Hall and Chief Charnock of the police department, that a strict watch be kept for speeders and that the city ordinance against same be enforced to the letter. More than the usual arrest of these offenders have been made by the police during the past few days, and the orders of the mayor and chief of police have been issued to suppress this dangerous pastime.

Charleston.—Assistant City Clerk J. O. Summers has compiled the police income during the year from January 3, 1920, to January 3, 1921, and states that the total amount of cases in police court was 4,715, netted an income of \$16,017.98, most of this resulting from fines and forfeitures. "Many business concerns are kicking at the success they had during the year just past," said Clerk Summers, "but we have no cause to kick over here. The visitors in our shrine have been mighty good to us, and we appreciate it. Here's hoping we have a bountiful year in 1921."

Parkersburg.—County Assessor E. E. Florence has returned from Charleston, where he attended the meeting of the West Virginia Assessors' Association, which was in session there, and which was addressed by State Tax Commissioner Hallinan, Judge Simms, Senator Blessing and other officials, and all the problems of the assessors were discussed. The tax commissioner advocates a number of changes in the line of the work and believes a re-assessment of the real estate of the state should be made. He will call another meeting of the assessors to be held at some date in March, when the plans proposed will be worked out.

Wheeling.—Rumors to the effect that Wheeling will seek to land the state capital are unfounded, according to officials of the Chamber of Commerce and local members of the legislature. While business men stand ready to donate a large sum of money to bring the capitol back here, they feel that geographical location practically precludes all possibility of Wheeling receiving favorable consideration, except from a few northern counties. Consequently, there will be no fight made when the legislature convenes. It is known that several members of the House, from Ohio and Marshall counties, are inclined to favor Parkersburg.

Moundsville.—One prisoner was killed, a tailor shop was set on fire, and the supply power for lights was disabled at the West Virginia penitentiary here by several prisoners who attempted to escape. The prisoner who was killed was on duty in the engine room. He was attacked by other convicts with knives, who entered the engine room and cut the belt of a gas engine. Warden Terrell announced that one prisoner, a man serving a life term, had escaped during the trouble. Henry Lucas, a prisoner from Kanawha county, is the dead man. Henry McCray, who was working with Lucas when the attack occurred, suffered several cuts, but will recover.

Charleston.—A writ of error and supersedeas was granted the defendant in the case of the state against Tony Stafford by the supreme court of appeal. Stafford had been indicted and convicted in Raleigh county for complicity in attempted murder, by helping to shoot up the Glen White coal mines at Glen White. Attorneys in the case are directed to appear before the supreme court of appeals for a complete rehearing of the case. Stafford, who had been sentenced to five years in the state penitentiary for the part he is alleged to have taken in the affair, petitioned the supreme court through his attorney, C. M. Ward, who presented 14 reasons why the case should be reheard.
