It may perchance interest the younger ones to know how the Arbutus came to, carpet the hills, but I will tell that sometime again. I will give a bit of the history of Pocahontas, which has never before been written.

When I was ten years old there lived in Augusta county, where I also lived, an old man who once a year in the spring stayed all night at my father's house, and spent the next day there on the farm performing veterinary operations. He tried to discover the proper place of concealment in the darkness. However he soon found himself in

strange surroundings-a place he did not know, and he was wondering where he could be. The cloud sud denly lifted and he saw that he was on the moon. By that time the moon had gotten so far from the mountain that he was afraid to jump back to earth. You see the moon was setting and it barely touched this mountain top at the moment Mr. Bozman arrived.

On the moon is a beautiful conntry of wooded hills and pleasant fertile valleys. 
