Scenic Highway

Aerial photography for mapping purposes has been completed over stretch of approximately 160 miles of land in Nicholas, Pocahontas, Randolph, Tucker, and Grant counties as the first phase of planning and engineering the West Virginia Highland Scenic Highway. Senator Jennings Randolph (D-W. Va.) says he has been informed by State Road Commissioner Burl A. Sawyers and Federal Highways Administrator Rex M. Whitton.

Preparation of maps from the aerial photographs is under way, Randolph said he has been informed, and he said the fact that the photos were made from the air before the foliage appeared on trees of the area will enhance and accelerate engineer planning and improve the prospects for an earlier than originally anticipated beginning of actual construction.

1963 March of Dimes

I want to take this opportunity to thank each and every one who helped in any way to make the 1963 March of Dimes Campaign a success. That is hardly enough to live on. Rents, in a respectable section of town, range from \$100 to \$140 for a furnished one-bedroom apartment. Even with a roommate that is a lot of money just for rent.

In the town of Marlinton that seems like a lot of money but everything is different in the city. This, I feel, is a fairly good opportunity for young girls but I think they should know all the facts. Another thing, the first promotion comes fast but then they slow down somewhat.

Centennial Churches

Baxter Presbyterian Church at Dunmore

On August 27, 1858, Baxter Church was dedicated to the service of Almighty God. The Dedication Sermon was preached by Rev. Charles C. M. See. His text was from Psalms 127: 1: "Except the Lord build this house, they labour in vain that build it." The number of original communicants was sixteen and these sixteen were transferred from Liberty Church at Green Bank. The first Ruling Elders of Baxter Presbyterian Church were Robert D. McCutcheon and Robert Curry. Robert D. McCutcheon was for many years Clerk of the Session.

The architecture of the church is Virginia Colonial, with recessed entrance and large white columns. The original slave gallery remains intact in the interior. The original pews, with partition in center which separated the men and women of the congregation of so long ago, are still in use. Despite the demands of time upon this building, the addition of a modern kitchen, and basement with church school classrooms, the general appearance of the Church remains as it was over a hundred years ago. The chancel and the sanctuary of the Church have been changed hardly at all.

During the years of War between the States, Baxter Church was several times used as a shelter by troops of the Union Army. The interior of the building was somewhat despoiled by this use. It was not until around 1900 that the last of the damage was repaired.

Baxter Church celebrated its fiftieth anniversary in 1908, when for the first time Greenbrier Presbytery met at the church. In 1958, during the 100th anniversary, Greenbrier Presbytery met there again.

Baxter Presbyterian Church has never been a church large in its number of communicants. Today there are about forty-five members. The most the church ever had was 90, but Baxter Church has always been a church of great influence upon its community and upon its sons and daughters who leave its rural setting to live and work in more populous areas. Among the more illustrious members of the church in the second half of the century is Miss Margaret Pritchard, Medical Missionary to Korea since 1931. Another outstanding leader was C. E. Pritchard, Clerk of the Session and active in every phase of the Church's life from 1891 until his death in 1936.

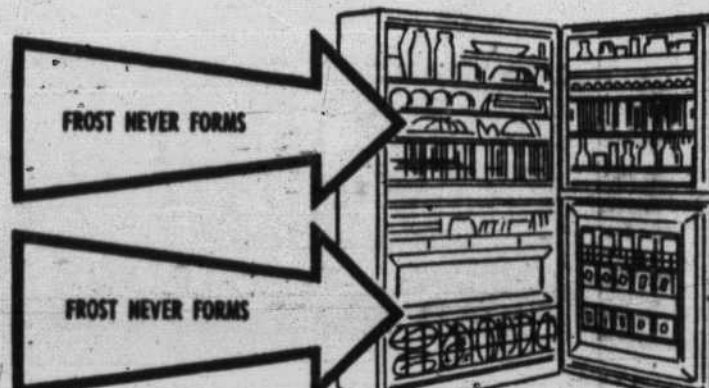
