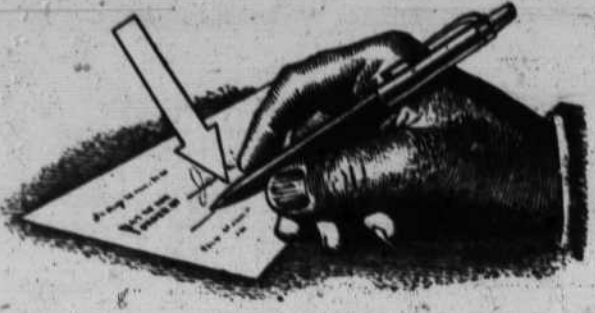

Letter

Below is a letter Harley Stagers shares with us:

One of the key features which greatly enhance further development of the Monongahela National Forest is, of course, the Highland Scenic Highway. As you know, it will pass close by the Cranberry Glades and other natural features of great interest. The Monongahela National Forest has been very active recently in the Marlinton-Richwood-White Sulphur Springs area. Outdoor recreation projects are being planned and many have been activated which are designed to take full advantage of the proximity of this new Scenic Drive.

For a number of years, a Federal prison camp was operated at Mill Point adjacent to the Cranberry Glades. This facility was vacated several years ago and the buildings, some of which are in bad repair, still remain. The facility has now reverted to the Forest Service, and some of these buildings will be removed.

After careful study, it was decided that this affords excellent opportunities for a resort type development. A prospectus has been developed and will be offered soon for consideration by private developers. This proposal will offer the land under bid procedures, and a special use permit will be awarded for resort operation on a concession basis. Private capital would develop the resort facility and pay into the U. S. Treasury a fee for use of the land.

This is the first time a venture of this type has been attempted on the Monongahela National Forest. In New England, we have extensive winter sports areas and other recreation facilities that have been developed by private capital on National Forest Lands. Vermont, for example, now entertains 400,000 winter visitors on the Green Mountain National Forest. It is estimated that these visitors spend an average of \$17.00-\$20.00 per day in the State.

The Mill Point area in West Virginia, located between Marlinton and Richwood, already includes scenic attractions such as Cranberry Glades, Falls of Hills Creek, beautiful autumn coloration, trout fishing, and hunting. The successful bidder may also develop winter sports, horseback riding on National Forest trails, and other features that will attract people.

The development of a "recreation complex" in this vast forest area in Pocahontas, Nicholas, and Greenbrier Counties could mark another milestone in providing maximum public benefits through multiple use management of the Forest.

CASS TRAIN

A nice crowd took the Saturday ride on the Cass Scenic Railroad and we feel it is the beginning of better things. The passenger cars have been built in good shape and it makes a pleasant ride. You can take a train up and stay over until a later trip back, if you desire, and enjoy a picnic or walk on the open hill side.

The road bed has been repaired for 4 miles. Parks Chief Kermit McKeever made the trip Saturday and he said he hoped before September a contract will be let to fix the whole length of the road.

Two interesting passengers were O. B. Collins of Thomas, born and raised in Pocahontas, who was a brakeman on the logging railroad from 1909 to about 1914, and Clarence Gilmore, of Davis, who was an engineer there and in the area from 1914 to 1924.

W. E. Blackhurst called the figures and was the source of information on the trip while Jack Kane kept a watchful eye on developments. According to Mr. Blackhurst two and a half billion feet of lumber came down that railroad in the 58 years it operated.

The SRC Maintenance Division will study bids before a purchase order contract is awarded on the project to be financed with state funds.

Centennial Churches

Tradition is that Mt. Zion Church was first built in 1808, on land belonging to Felix Grimes who settled in the community in 1770. The deed was given September 6, 1836, by Charles Grimes (son of Felix) and Martha, his wife, to James Wanless, William Moore, John Wanless, James Grimes, Henry Arbogast and John Waugh—trustees. "Consisting of 2 acres and 51 poles, it being a part of the survey of 510 acres granted to Felix Grimes by a patent, and devised to said Charles Grimes in his will."

They sold it to the church for \$5.00. The deed reads thus: "Together with all and singular the houses, wood, waters, privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise pertaining to, to have and to hold, the above mentioned and described parcel of land to the above named trustees, and their successors in office forever in trust that they shall erect or cause to be erected or build a house, a place of worship for the use of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America according to the rules and regulations", etc.

On November 20, 1848 in a report to Conference by the trustees, Martin Dilley, Washington Moore, and Beverly Waugh, they stated that the building was completed to the ceiling, the cost had been \$300 and \$50 should finish it. Preston Moore, Harvey Curry, and Moses Moore were appointed trustees to fill the vacancies which had occurred. This church originally had a gallery for the use of the slaves.

The people of upper Knappa Creek rode horseback by way of Mill Run to Mt. Zion. Then in 1850 they decided to build a church of their own and they built Mount Vernon.

After the Civil War the Dilleys and Shraders and others withdrew from Mount Zion because they found it closed to them and they built Bethel in 1877.

The Mt. Zion Church is still used for funerals and home-comings.

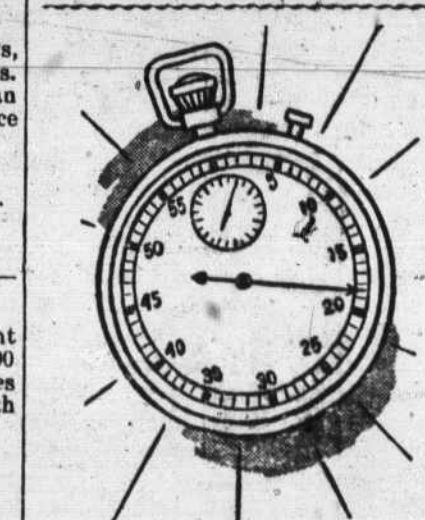

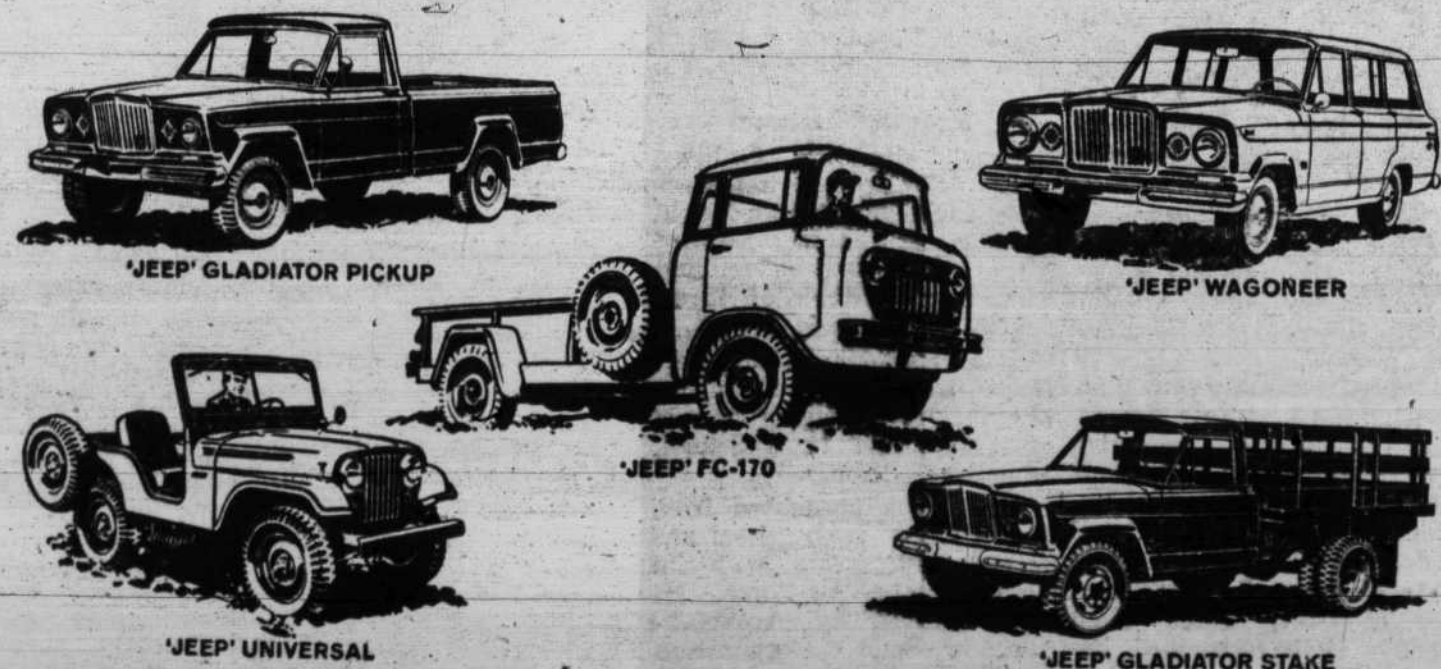
