#### County Post Offices

For some time we have been trying to ascertain which was the first post office in Pocahontas County and in our search we obtained photostatic copies of the postoffice records from the National Archives in Washington. Cackleys, (Mill Point) established February 7, 1822 had earlier been recorded as the first post office, but Traveler's Repose has a date of first return of July 1, 1814, so it must take the honor. Mrs. Fred Allen told me several months ago she had just learned that Minnehaha Springs had once been named Driscoll, which was the name of a lumber man, so many will be surprised at the many unfamiliar names in this list of post offices, their dates of establishment, and first post masters
