Planning and Zoning

Planning and zoning are a means of insurance in the development of our county. We all need to learn, think, read and talk more about the possibilities. On September 26, Claude A. Kemper and Bob Dyck, a professional architect and "planner," both with the Appalachian Center at the University, and Frank Wade, Rural Area Development agent, brought to a group at the Court House the basic reasoning for planned development. Mr. Kemper used visual illustrations that every one of us is used to zoning. The family is the primary unit. Every home is zoned for different uses of different parts, and there is a place and need for muddy boots but not in the living room. Every farm is zoned—the house and yard for beauty, the barns and out buildings where they are convenient and useful. A pig pen is important, but no one puts it in the front yard. There must be a place for everything. Home, farm, community—just different forms of authority.

Use and beauty are the key words, and a place for every thing. Planning is deciding what you want and zoning is the tool to use to get what you want.

Every plan must come from what the people in each community want. Nothing can be changed that is already here—only the future can be planned.

Seriously consider what you can do to improve your property. If you are selling lots, think what requirements you can write into the deed to be sure the buildings will improve your property and your county. Look at things around you and see what changes ought to be planned for.

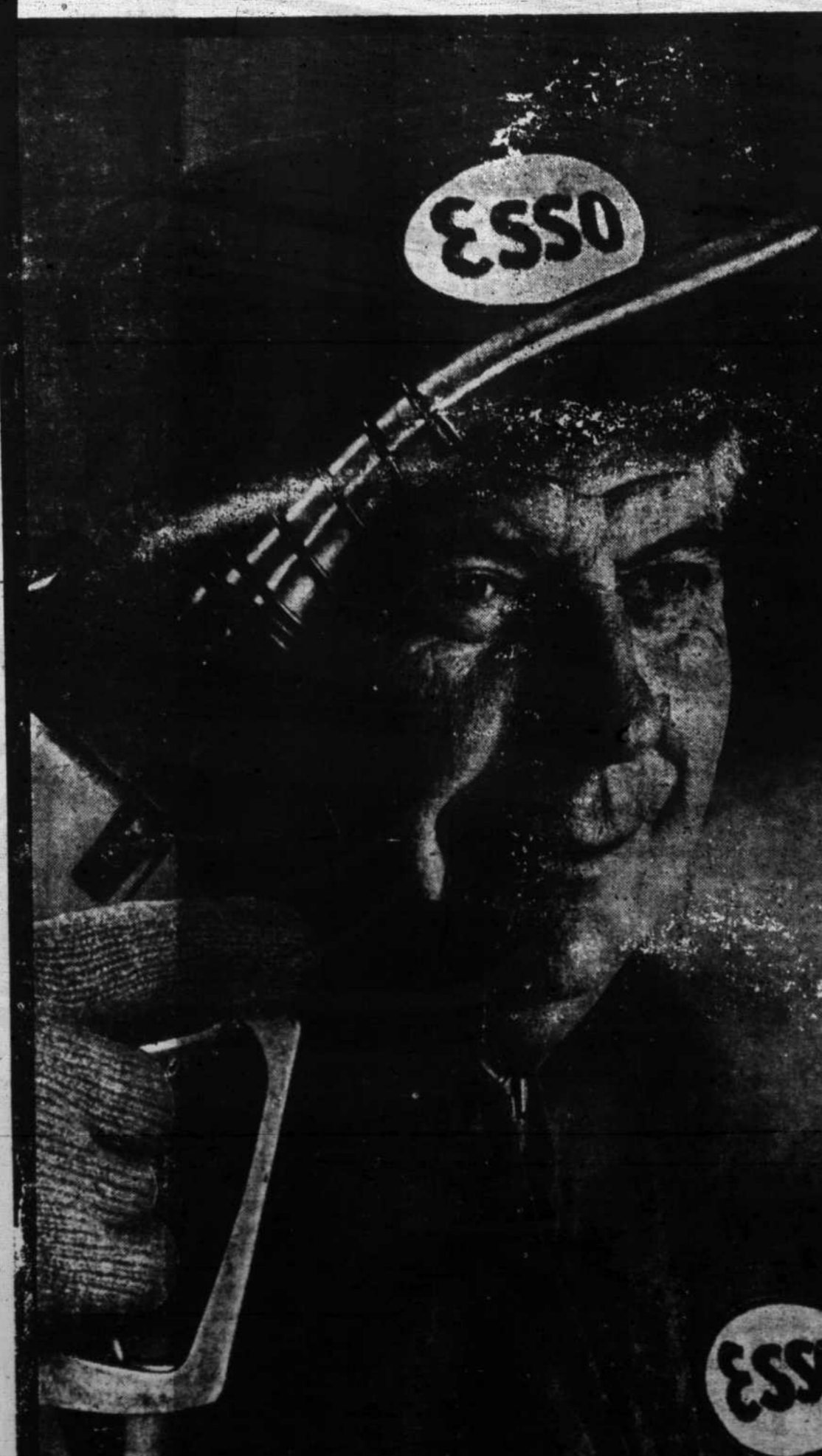

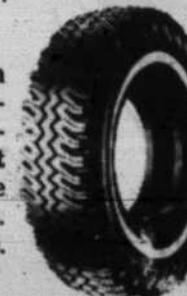
