Golden Rules For Frozen Foods Care

The rules are few and simple, but they do protect the gold mine of nutrients and wealth of good eating qualities for which frozen foods are famous.

LOOK FOR: Neat packages, free of stains, tears or dents.

HOW MUCH TO BUY: Read the label. If package contains more than needed, use just the amount wanted and return remainder to freezer for another meal.

STORAGE: Frozen foods may be kept at 0°F. in freezer or freezer compartment for weeks or months; at 32°F. in ice cube compartment for 1 week; at 40°F. or refrigerator shelf for 24 hours.

IN THE FREEZER: Remember to place recent frozen food purchases toward back or bottom, rotating the items to use first the foods which have been stored longest.

REFREEZING: If frozen foods should accidentally defrost, they may be refrozen without appreciable change in quality if the package contents are still cold to touch—at least 40°F., the temperature inside a refrigerator.
