Farm Meeting
 The joint Annual Member ship meeting of the Pocahontas County Farm Bureau and the Pocahontas Producers Cooperative Association held Saturday in Marlinton was the occasion for electing new directors, hearing committee reports, and receiving business and financial statements.

During the business session of the Farm Bureau, the following were named to the Board of Directors for a period of two years: Little Levels—Kyle Beard, Beard; Green Bank—Albert Wilfong, Dunmore; Huntersville—Max White, Minnehaha Springs; and Edray—John Coyner, Cloverlick. The Director-at-Large was Gay Sharp.

During a very impressive Memorial Service, in charge of Sohia Pritchard, deceased members, Mrs. Margaret Herold, Huntersville, and Hunter A. Hively, Dunmore, were honored.

In recognition of long years of faithful service to Farm Bureau the following members were honored with 20, 30, and 40 year pins and certificates: Forty years—Charles Wilfong, Dunmore, and D. M. Callison, Beard. Thirty years—C. C. Jutlip, Hillsboro; G. A. Hull, Hillsboro; Allen Sharp, Marlinton; E. Ernest White, Minnehaha Springs; and Joel P. Beard, Hillsboro. Twenty years—Howard Hevener, Arbovale; Paul and Virginia Hevener, Cloverlick; Johnnie B. Hill, Hillsboro; Jacob and Cathleen Hoover, Marlinton; and Mrs. Elmer Moore and Hal, Minnehaha Springs.

A group luncheon was held for approximately 100 members and guests immediately after which the Farm Bureau women met during which time Mrs. Mary Lou Dilley, of Huntersville, was re-elected Chairman of the County Women's Committee.

The afternoon session was devoted to the business of the Cooperative Livestock Marketing Association.

The business and audit report indicated a small drop in livestock handled, especially lambs, however it continues to operate in the black at the very low cost to producers of 2.32 per cent of gross.

Joseph C. Emch, Extension Livestock Specialist, in his report on the Feeder Calf Sales of the state, indicated that the Pocahontas Sales was of above average quality and selling price. Only 8 percent of our calves graded medium and plain as against 16 per cent for the entire state.

Dr. Farrell J. Olsen, Extension Agronomist, West Virginia University, in his keynote address stressed the growing need for pasture improvement if the farmers of Pocahontas County are to continue to compete successfully in the livestock business.

During the election two directors were elected to serve three year terms. They were Albert Wilfong, Dunmore and Dayton Herold, Huntersville. Henry G. Hevener was elected to serve a two year unexpired term caused by a resignation.
