**Public Hearing**  
A public hearing was held by the State Road Commission in Green Bank Tuesday on a proposed change in Route 7, between Route 28 and Cass. The project will consist of 1.327 miles of road including a bridge of 178.86 feet; there will be two 10 foot lanes, 7-foot shoulders (9 where there is a guard rail), stone base with approved topping, with access to existing roads and driveways. It will cross lands of Willie Sheets, George H. Sheets heirs, L. C. McCutcheon heirs and Jack and Ernest Kane.

In answer to a question concerning the purpose of the road, a representative gave as reasons: improvement of route, reduce mileage, eliminate curves, and safety features, in view of the increased traffic in that area. In answering others he said that it does not mean the former section of road will be abandoned if people need it; they realize there are other pressing road problems, such as curves and narrow bridges, but they are getting to them as fast as surveys, studies, and decisions can be made and the money is available.

There appeared to be no objection to the road but several felt there were other places that were more in need of repair.

There was no mention made by anyone in the official record that the re-routing of the road would help reduce the interference from traffic to the big telescope at the Observatory.

The Rev. Sewell Woodward, Jr., pastor of the First Methodist Church in Pineville, Kentucky, has joined 30 others for an Educational Seminar which left June 22 to travel in Europe and the Holy Land.

This year the Seminar is directed by Dr. H. A. Hanks of Asbury College and Dr. G. A. Turner, of Asbury Theological Seminary, both of Wilmore, Kentucky. They will visit Madrid and Toledo, Spain, see the art of El Greco, fly to Rome and tour ancient ruins and Vatican City then to Egypt to see the Pyramids, a camel ride and a boat ride up the Nile River by moonlight. Crossing over from Egypt, the group will make a four day safari to the peak of Mt. Sinai, later to Damascus, on through Syria to Jordan and Palestine, where they will see Jerusalem, the Garden of Gethsemane, the tomb of Christ, Mount of Olives and the sight of Solomon's Temple.

Other interesting visits will be made to Venice and Milan, Italy; Interlakin, Switzerland; Germany, Amsterdam, Holland; Paris, France; London, England; Turkey and Greece.
