History Of Medicine



SMALLPOX - The first vaccination against smallpox was performed by Edward Jenner, English country physician, in his apartment in 1796. This painting from Parke. Davis & Company's History of Medicine series recaptures the historic scene in which Jenner scratches the arm of eight-year-old James Phipps and inserts "... matter ... taken from a sore on the hand of a dairymaid who was infected by her master's cows ..." The vaccination with cowpox serum was effective since two later attempts to induce infection with smallpox were unsuccessful. Proving and reproving his discovery, Jenner published his vaccination findings in 1798. Despite opposition, vaccination became accepted practice during Jenner's lifetime. In the United States, Professor Benjamin Waterhouse performed the first vaccination in July, 1800, with material received from London.
