The old log house on the farm of Mr. A. J. Workman had floors made of inch bards. A man maned Willam killer had hered the boards by hand out of poplar. To clean these floors, tay would gut sand on them about an inch thick. This would be left on four or five days and when the floors were scrubbed, they would be while and clean. The pioneer homes ware kapt scruppusly clean.

There were no regular hours for work. Both the sen and the wooms worked from deylight to dark. The food were covere but thay had planty of it. Such a thing as a balanced meal had nover head heard of. They had planty of all kinds of wild mat and fish. Corn meal was used mostly for bread, but once in a great while they would mave wheat bread. This was quite a treat.

The loundry was done at the creek when it was not too cold. They used big kottles for hashing the water. Iron cooking utensils ware used almost altogather bacause the food was cooked over a firspince or in the cole.

In those days thars was not so much stress laid on bathing but every boy could swim and from early spring until late fall, they went to the oresk to swim and incidentally bethe.
