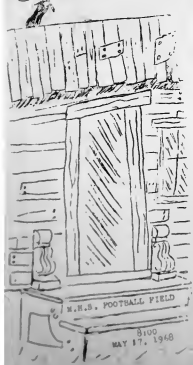

Deposits are not required for regularly scheduled performances.

If your group has reserved tickets for a regularly scheduled performance, tickets must be paid for in full prior to your group's Train Departure in order to guarantee seats for that days performance.

Individuals must pick up and pay for tickets prior to their Train Departure.

Tickets can be paid for and picked up at the Information Booth located in the Last Run Restaurant in the Cass Country Store the day of the performance.
