LIST OF HIGHWAY HISTORIC MARKERS IN WEST VIRGINIA

Compiled by Dr. Charles P. Harper

The list of eighty-five War Between the States highway markers includes those erected on primary roads in West Virginia in the 1930's and during the Centennial Year by the West Virginia Historic Commission in cooperation with the State Road Commission. It gives the titles of the markers and locations by counties of the United States or West Virginia highways and the nearest town where they are placed. In addition to locating practically every site in the state that had some connection with the War Between the States, either battles, skirmishes or leaders, the list gives the location of Carnifex Ferry Battlefield State Park, Droop Mountain Battlefield State Park, Harpers Ferry National Park, the National Cemetery and monuments honoring both the Blue and the Gray.
