One of the principal tributaries of Knappa Creek of the Lynchburg neighborhood carries with it the waters of Coopers Creek. At Huntersville Knappa Creek receives two other streams, Browns Creek from one side and Williams Creek from the other.

Along the valley are numerous limestone springs, the waters of which are of an excellent quality. These help to make the creek larger. The first of these is a bold spring gushing out from under a hill near the farm home of S. Gibson. Further down the valley we find two streams called Mill Run near A. C. Moore's and receives water from a number of springs within a half mile. Next to the mill run at W. W. Weaver's flowing through his farm where fine cattle grazed. Near the farm of W. D. L. Richens's there is another stream of about equal volume. And a river of it is also a magnificent never failing stream.

Next but no least is the famous Lynchburg Spring on the Lynchburg property. The crystal water of this spring is of a healing and medicinal nature. It has been shipped to various parts of the country.

Crooked Neck - The hills in the valley region in the northwest of the valley are very productive lands and are excellent for fruit and grain. The hills are heavily timbered but now only small tracts remain about.
