JOHN A. SYDENSTRICKER

John Andrew Sydenstricker, 77, vice president and cashier of the First National Bank of Marlinton, died at 8:30 Monday morning, Dec. 12, 1955, of a heart attack at the bank. He had not been well for about 10 days, but had felt well enough to go to the bank that morning. He was a native of Pocahontas county, born at Hillsboro, a son of the late Dr. and Mrs. David Sydenstricker. His father was a Presbyterian minister, who served the Hillsboro Church many years. He was a graduate of Hampden-Sydney College, Virginia, and had been with the bank since 1903. At the time of his death he was serving his 14th year as a director of the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond, and was a Mason of 50 years standing. Funeral services were to be held Wednesday afternoon at the Marlinton Presbyterian Church, his pastor, the Rev. E. H. Flaniken to officiate, and burial to follow in Mountain View cemetery. He is survived by his widow, the former Miss Florence Kramer of Roanoke; a brother, J. Lacy Sydenstricker of Indianapolis, Ind., and two sisters, Miss Virginia Sydenstricker and Mrs. Ivan Colson, both of Roanoke, Va.
