In 1893, the Methodists bought one were of land from Liss wells P. Clark for two hundred dollars, for the new church which they anticipated building. This site is located on the main highway, Route # 219, leading through the town of Millsboro.

The deed: "ay 20, 1893 between hella F. Clark of the first part and Jeo. will, N. B. C. Kennison, Jno. ". Peard, "A. H. Callison, Damuel Auldridge, "M. H. Cverholt, H. W. Mill & E. H. Moore, Trustees of "esley Chapel M. E. Church South, of the second part, one acre of land in the town of Millsboro adjoining the lands of Dr. J. A. Larew, for a place of Divine worship for the use of the ministry and membership of the methodist Episcopal Church South.

This beautiful modern frame building was statted in 1899 and completed and dedicated in 1800. The contractor was Lr. Stewart Emapp. The Rev. J. H. Dills was pestor at the time the work on this church was started but nev. J. ... whitesell was on the circuit when the church was completed and dedicated. Nev. Pettyman preached the dedicatory sermon. The Nev. J. D. Martin was Presiding Lider at that time.

The church building on the hill beside the personage utood for several years and was used for a recreation room and a cort of a gymnesium but was torn down many years ago.

This wethod at organization at Hillsboro owned the first parsonage in Posshontas County. In the year of 1871 tare toge only three parsonages owned he the churches in

one of them. The deed for the lot on which the parsonage now stands was made in 1847. The Deed recorded in Deed Book 10.4, page 3.0: Between Nathaniel Minnison of one part and George Burner, Nathaniel Minnison, John Mill, Abram Hill, John H. Muckman, John Mooddell, James "anless and Milliam Young, Trustees, in trust for uses and purposes hereinafter mentioned, one acre adjoining the lands of James Lewis and Damuel Poage, In Trust that they shall erect or cause to be erected and built thereon a parsonage or preachers house for the use of the ministers of the Methodist Episcopal Church. I have been unable to find the exact date that the parsonage was built but it must have been built soon after the deed was made. The parsonage is in the same location today. However, the building has been remodeled and is now a modern building with well taken care of grounds.

There has been a bunday school in this church ever since anyone can remember hearing about. I.r. Joel Hill was the first Junday School Superintendent that anyone can remember, but several old people have told me that there was a Sunday School before Mr. Hill was Supt.

The Supt. of the Sunday School at the present time is ar. George Sendenen, and the enrollment is about one hundred.
