LITTLE LOG CHURCH -

This historic log Church is about two miles south of Droop Mountain Battlefield Park. It is almost a hundred years old. About ten years ago a new floor and ceiling, also a new roof made it a cosy little country church. Last summer a sweet toned bell was placed in this church and services are held there Sunday. This spot was included in the hunting ground of the Shawnee Indians, also other tribes who fought fierce battles on Droop Mountain. On this side of the church not visible in the picture is a peculiar spot, said at one time to have been an Indian mound but it is now washed or worn away, and that in this mound the Indians buried gold and other valuables that they had received from the white people. Fierce battles had been fought among the Indians of various tribes many years before the battle of the Civil War. For proof arrow heads, flints, broken tomahawks and other instruments of war were found by the pioneers. This historic church is on the Seneca Trail State road.
