Timber Famine Predicted.

Every person in the United States is using over six times as much wood as he would if he were in Europe. The country as a whole, consumes every year, between three and four times more wood than all of the forests of the United States grew in the mean-time.

These statements are made in a lengthy statement on the lumber crop issued today by the forestry service of the department of agriculture. A timber famine is predicted unless more economic use of lumber is inaugurated and government control is instituted to prevent waste in use to increase the growth of the forest lands.
