Word was received here last Tuesday morning of another mur der in the "Binks" of Pocahontas county, the victim being Isaac Arbogast, Jr. a native and a residept of that community. The murder was committed Monday evening and the murderer himself escaped death at the hands of an trate father by flight. Prosecut ing Attorney Hill went to the scene of the murder Tuesday morning and an inquest was held by Squi e A. M.
