SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The income this year derived from taxes and State and Federal grants, have made it possible to pay off the deficit of last year, and provide the usual services. It was also possible to buy a new Chevrolet dump truck, and pay a portion of the cost of a new Police Car, purchased by the Village. In place of the deficit, there is a balance of \$4,505.69 in the General Account.

The Selectmen authorized the painting of a white center line the entire length of the West Road to the Town line. This is a new safety measure which has the approval of the State District Highway Engineer. He has sent us his compliments on this project, and hopes that other towns will follow suit.

By having a Civil Defense Organization, Proctor has been able to qualify for Surplus Government Property consisting of a 1951 Ford Platform truck for \$50.00 and a truck snow plow for \$10.00, plus 50 gallons of Government paint for \$10.00. The snow plow has been fitted to the new dump truck. Now we have two trucks for snow plowing.

The distribution of Government Surplus Food Commodities has been continued again this year, some 12,374 pounds, valued at approximately \$2,788.00 being given to needy families.

Extensive repairs required on the Town houses, and higher costs of Hospital and Medical care have increased the welfare expenses over last year's.

Again we wish to take this opportunity to express our thanks to all town officers, townspeople and the State and County officials who have assisted us in so many ways this year.

HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

1960

Town Highways

During the past year (1960) the following streets were sealed with asphalt and then covered with grits or $\frac{1}{2}$ " stone:

School Street	0.20 mile
Cliff Street	0.19 "
Pine Street	0.15 "
Market Street	0.25 "
Beaver Pond Road	0.30 "
Warner and Olympus	0.30 "

The total cost of labor and material was \$2,644.59, for which the State fully reimbursed the Town.

State Aid Highway

On West Road (Route 2) for 1.8 miles starting at Rutland Town line and extending north, the road was given a blade mix with $\frac{1}{2}$ pea stone added. Beginning at McGarry's store and extending northerly to the Carpenter Shop crossing, the same repair was made to this road.

The Total cost for labor and material was \$5,200.54, of which the reimbursement from the State was \$3,467.03.

New Construction

Starting on the Florence Road at the point of Beaver Pond Road intersection and extending northerly 0.75 mile, this road was relocated to eliminate the curve. In this relocation work there was excavation, installation of culverts, construction of ditches, putting a 24" base of gravel and double tack coat the entire length. Also installed were guard posts for the entire distance. The cost of labor and material was \$16,761.41.

The re-imbusement from the State on these expenses was \$16,761.41.

During 1961 we will receive from the State approximately \$6,000 to be used for new construction on Town and State aid highways. These funds will only be paid by the State when the work is performed. If there is not any new work during this year, the funds will accumulate for use in following years.

Equipment

During 1960 the Town purchased a new Chevrolet 1961 dump truck (2½ tons). Also we have a snow plow which we can attach, giving two serviceable snow plows.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

1960

Proctor continues to be a health spot. We have had mild outbreaks of communicable diseases and one case of hepatitis. Neither the virulence or the number have been cause for alarm. I feel this happy state is due to the greatly improved standard of living and a well regulated child health program. School clinics are well attended and very adequate help is rendered by the town women. It is a pleasure to work with them and I'd like to take this opportunity to extend my thanks.

The water situation is still excellent. The past year 52 samples were submitted and only one showed contamination. With the addition of our new artesian well, the water supply should continue to be adequate and potable.

VERMONT STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
ANNUAL TOWN REPORT, 1960

The health of the town of Proctor is the concern of its citizens, its doctors, health officer, selectmen and the State Department of Health.

Through its various programs the State Department of Health staff works with and for local people on community health, operating on both local and state levels. This is a report of some of the State Health Department services and programs your town used last year.*

With the aim of keeping children well and helping handicapped children, well-child and school conferences were attended by 38 children. Nutrition and dietary consultations numbered 5. At the request of attending doctors no children received pediatric consultations, none received hospital diagnosis, 4 with orthopedic, cardiac, plastic or neurological conditions received services or appliances through clinics for handicapped children and none were given financial aid toward hospitalization costs. Mental retardation clinic services were extended to no children.

In the effort to control communicable disease 13 persons received chest X-rays; 51 children received immunizations, including boosters, against diphtheria, whooping cough and or tetanus. Polio immunizations, including boosters, were given 9 children and adults in clinics and conferences. The State Laboratory performed tests on 68 water samples, no food and dairy products, 86 blood specimens and 15 other specimens. Vaccines, antitoxins and biologicals were distributed for protection against communicable diseases.

There were 24 sanitary inspections or consultations made at the town's food and lodging places and 23 concerning water supply, sewage disposal, public buildings and other problems, to protect health through improved town sanitation. Services to maintain and improve adult health in industry included no chest

X-rays and inspections and consultations at plants. In connection with the state licensing program and the Hill-Burton federal aid program for hospital and medical facility construction there was 1 inspection, consultations to hospitals, nursing homes and homes for the aged.

Mental health services, through guidance clinics, educational meetings or consultations, were received by 3 persons and groups. Individual interviews with the psychiatrist, psychologist or psychiatric social worker were given 5. Under the community mental health program to develop local projects for prevention, treatment or education in mental health, financial assistance and staff consultations are available.

To promote better dental health no consultations and services were provided groups or individuals on town or school dental health problems.

In cancer work 2 received diagnosis and treatment at tumor clinics or were financially helped with hospitalization costs.

All programs in the department offer educational services. Pamphlets, films, a news release and information service and speakers are available. A health educator is available to help town groups study their health problems and plan educational programs.

The Public Health nurse served at well-child and school conferences, X-ray and immunization clinics, assisted by local people. She visited homes, doctors, and agencies, making 180 visits on behalf of 43 persons and community health activities. Her service is an essential element in the department's program for health promotion, disease prevention, diagnosis, treatment and education.

FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

During the year 1960 your fire warden was required to issue no permits for burning and there were no fires, but a few calls were made which were checked out. The Town purchased 12 brass pack pumps for our use in the event of forest fires. These cost \$28.70 each, which is two-thirds of the retail price. Until these have been used, they will remain an expense of the Town, but once put into service they will then be paid for by the State.

Burning can be done at any time without a permit within Village limits, as long as a good incinerator with proper cover is used. This should be placed in a clear space at least 12 feet in diameter.

1. To elect by ballot a Moderator, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, a Selectman, an Overseer of the Poor, a Road Commissioner, 2 Listers, an Auditor, a First and a Second Constable, a Collector of Taxes, a First and Second Grand Juror, a Town Agent, and a Cemetery Commissioner.

2. To vote on the following questions:

Shall licenses for the sale of malt and vinous beverages be granted in the Town?

Shall spirituous liquors be sold in this Town?

3. To hear and act upon the reports of the Town Officers.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise more than twenty cents on the dollar highway tax as required by law, and to take advantage of the provisions of Chapter 1, Title 19 VSA.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money by taxation or otherwise to pay current expenses, such State taxes as required by law and the indebtedness of the Town.

6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate money for the care and embellishment of the Riverside Cemetery, and if so, how much?

7. To see if the Town under the provisions of Section 4526 of the Vermont Statutes, Revision of 1947 will vote to contract with the Proctor Free Library to furnish books to inhabitants of the Town free and to appropriate money therefor.

8. To see when the taxes voted and State taxes assessed shall be payable.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Article 2, Chapter 133 of Title 32 VSA, for the collection of taxes by the Town Treasurer.

10. To see if the Town will vote any compensation to Town Officers.
