

Member of the Gestapo - Sonder Rommando (June 1940 - Jan. 45). Accused of ill-treatment and torture, causing death of prisoners.

HSF.

Camp Commandant for part of period: 27-6-42 to 7-4-44. Responsible for gassing of prisoners.

Habitual criminal; a notorious murderer in this camp, (13.4.1942 - 7.4.1944).

Rank unknown.

DANIES (DANISCH), Franz:

Kapo.

(13.4.1942 - 7.4.1944.) Political Prisoner, No. 11182, Domicile at Koenigshuette - Upper Silesia. Senior of the punishment block and later camp senior. He threatened Jewish new-comers with torture and forced many to commit suicide.

SS-man.

Reported to have killed 260 prisoners in one day by smashing their skulls.

A German doctor. Performed operations for hernia on many prisoners simply for practice.

Physician, University - Professor; carried out medical experiments on prisoners. (June 1940 - end 1943).

GRABNER (GRAUNER):

USF.

Camp leader and Chief of Political Section. He "evacuated" the overcrowded cells from time to time by shooting the immates. A very brutal character.

HARTENSTEIN, (HACKENSTEIN, HARTGENSTEIN), Fritz:

SBF.

Camp commandant for part of period 27.6.42 - 7.4.44. Accused of ill-treatment, causing death of prisoners, of torture, and of murder, See: NATZWEILER.

OSEF.

Administrative Staff, (June 1940 - end 1943). Accused of ill-treatment, torture and murder of prisoners.

KITT. Dr. Med.:

Oscharf.

HSF.

A German doctor, took part in selecting prisoners for killing. Worked under Dr. MENGELE (March 43 - August 44). Accused of ill-treatment, causing death, and murder of prisoners.

KLER:

SS-man, later promoted.

Infirmary assistant; killed prisoners by lethal injections; a sadist who tortured his victims with brutal cruelty before killing them; Was awarded the Iron Cross.

A German doctor; performed amputations by way of practice; selected prisoners for killing. Accused of ill-treatment, causing death of prisoners, murder, and other crimes.

KOCHANN:

Rank unknown.

A German doctor; conducted experiments resulting in sterilization and injuries to the skin.

HSF.

Commandant of camp Birkenau, former adjutant of HSFF Hoess. Responsible for mass gassing of Hungarian Jews from the 15th May 1943 onwards. Lately Commandant of Belsen concentration camp. Sentenced to death by British Military Court (15/11/45). See also: Dachau, Belsen, Natzweiler.

1939 - 1945; Accused of ill-treatment, causing death of prisoners; and of other crimes.

LIEBEGENSCHEE), Arthur:

OSEF.

Camp Commandant for some period. He issued an order offering RM 60 to SS-men for every prisoner killed 'while attempting to escape'. To obtain this reward the guards murdered with impunity. Later Head of Amt I of Amtsgruppe D of W.V.H.A. Berlin.

Accused of ill-treatment, causing death, torture, and nurders of prisoners.
